<b>Day 1 – Capital City</b>	Arrive in San Fernando del Valle, visit the Virgen del Valle Basilica	Walk historic center and museums	Dinner with regional empanadas
<b>Day 2 – Ruta del Adobe</b>	Drive to Tinogasta, explore adobe chapels	Continue to Fiambalá, visit vineyards	Overnight in Fiambalá
<b>Day 3 – Fiambalá &amp; Hot Springs</b>	Morning at Fiambalá thermal baths	Short hike in surrounding mountains	Stargazing in Fiambalá
<b>Day 4 – Campo de Piedra Pómez</b>	Guided 4x4 tour to volcanic formations	Picnic in the Puna	Return to Fiambalá
<b>Day 5 – Belén &amp; Return</b>	Visit artisan workshops in Belén	Scenic drive back to capital	Farewell dinner

### Travel Tips for Catamarca



**4x4 recommended** – Many top attractions require off-road driving.



**Pack for altitude** – Puna regions can be cold year-round.



**Fuel up in advance** – Long stretches without gas stations.



**Support local artisans** – Catamarca ponchos are highly prized.



**Take it slow at altitude** – Avoid rushing high-elevation visits.
