



Where to Go & What to Do



Iguazu Falls & Iguazu National Park

- 1 The crown jewel of Misiones, Iguazú Falls, is one of the Natural Wonders, with over 229 plunging cascades, including the famous Garganta del Diablo (Devil's Throat).
- 2 Explore elevated walkways offering panoramic vistas, and consider a boat ride on "La Gran Aventura" for a thrilling splash zone experience.



Saltos del Moconá & Esmeralda / Urugua-i Parks



Beautiful parks offering ranger-led trails, bird-watching, camping and jungle hikes.



Moconá Falls (Saltos del Moconá) are unusual water flows running parallel to the Parana River.



Esmeralda Provincial Park is central within the Biosphere Reserve. Ideal for biodiversity exploration and research stations.



Uruguay Provincial Park - adjacent to Iguazu National Park- offering a variety of trails.



Jesuit Missions & San Ignacio Mini



Discover the remarkably preserved San Ignacio Mini, part of a tour around Jesuit Reductions declared UNESCO World Heritage sites.



Nearby ruins like Santa Ana, Loreto, and Santa Maria la Mayor provide quieter atmospheric experiences, with guided tours and on-site museums.



What to Do: Experiences & Tours



Join full-day or multi-day tours. Combine Iguazú Falls, Moconá, and the Jesuit missions for a complete Misiones itinerary



Opt for jungle and river excursions, kayaking through forest rivers, wildlife gazing or guided treks in Urugua-i Park.



Bird-watching and nature trails in protected parks offer opportunities to see primates, toucans and exotic flora.
