

Our Heavenly Father—our Creator—has a Personal Name. In Aramaic Square Script Hebrew it is: יהוה. In Paleo Hebrew Script it is יהוה. One transliterated version into English to help with sound pronunciation is “Yahuah,” additionally “Yah” for short—יה or יה. Other English transliterations do exist.

Our Messiah—our Savior—has a Personal Name as well. Similarly in Aramaic it is written יהושע or OWYAH in Paleo—transliterated to English by some as Yahusha. Other English transliterations do exist.

**(KJV)** Hast thou not known? hast thou not heard, *that* the everlasting God, the LORD, the Creator of the ends of the earth, fainteth not, neither is weary? *there is* no searching of his understanding.

**(Cepher)** Have you not known? Have you not heard, *that ElohaiOlam, Yahuah*, the Creator of the ends of the earth, faints not, neither is weary? *There is* no searching of his understanding.

**(TS2009)** Did you not know? Have you not heard? The everlasting Elohim, יהוה, the Creator of the ends of the earth, neither faints nor is weary. His understanding is unsearchable.

**(YS)** Did you not know? Have you not heard? The everlasting Elohim, יהוה, the Creator of the ends of the earth, neither faints nor is weary. His understanding is unsearchable.

**(Brenton)** And now, hast thou not known? hast thou not heard? the eternal God, the God that formed the ends of the earth, shall not hunger, nor be weary, and there is no searching of his understanding.
