

## Our Creator's Personal Name in Scripture is Written as: יהוה or אֱלֹהִים Transliterated into English One Way is: Yahuah (Yah Who Ah)

Our Heavenly Father—our Creator—has a Personal Name. In Aramaic Square Script Hebrew it is: יהוה. In Paleo Hebrew Script it is אֱלֹהִים. One transliterated version into English to help with sound pronunciation is “Yahuah,” additionally “Yah” for short—יה or אֱ. Other English transliterations do exist.

Our Messiah—our Savior—has a Personal Name as well. Similarly in Aramaic it is written יְהוֹשֻׁעַ or מָשִׁיחַ in Paleo—transliterated to English by some as Yahusha. Other English transliterations do exist.

Very importantly again, our Creator—our Heavenly Father—just like you and me, has a personal Name—Yahuah, or Yah for short.

Humans are very persnickety about the spelling and pronunciation of their name(s). My family (to this day) hates it when our last name—our surname—is not pronounced correctly, (or as they deem to have it pronounced). My last name is spelled “ROHDE,” yet, most people who don’t know me choose to pronounce those letters like the USA state of “Rhode” Island. The pronunciation of my surname however, is like the word “ROW” followed by the letter “D” (as in David). “ROW D,” not “road.”

Think about all of the people living today who are named “Peter.” If any individuals named “Peter” travel to France, they are still called “Peter.” They are not suddenly called “Pierre,” which is a French “translation” (not a transliteration) for the name “Peter.” Similarly, people named “Pierre” are still called “Pierre” wherever they happen to go.

Humans are created in the image of our Creator (**Genesis 1:27**); so if we humans are picky about the spelling, and very importantly the pronunciation of our name(s), don’t you think that maybe our Creator might like us to call on Him (address Him correctly) by His personal Name as well?

Scripture tells us to do just that as early as **Genesis 4:26**, **Genesis 12:8**, **Genesis 13:4**, and **Genesis 26:25** as examples. We are continually told throughout the Old and New Testaments to “Call upon the Name” of our Creator. How can we call upon the Name of our Creator (pray, pronounce, and say it), when we don’t even know what His Personal Name is? How His Name is written in any world language is not as important as how we pronounce it—the sound matters. I don’t turn when someone calls out “Hey road,” but I do turn when someone says, “Hey Row D,” or “Hey Roadie.” Our Creator wants us to call on His True Name—He wants a relationship with each of us.

The King James Version (KJV) and its derivatives do not help us with regard to pronouncing our Creator’s Name. They hinder immensely because **the translators changed His Name** to words which go against Scripture, as Scripture flat out tells us that we must not add to or subtract from it (which would include any changes as well). Reference **Deuteronomy 4:2** and **Revelation 22:18-19**. Some hard printed copies of the KJVs openly state that the Creator’s Name has been changed to “G-o-d,” “L-O-R-D,” or “L-o-r-d” for example, while many do not. If one wants to know our Creator’s Name, we have to ask Father to help us; and then often one has to go to different English Translations—like The Scriptures, Cephher, Yah Scriptures, and the Hebrew Gospels.
