

Yah's Ten (10) Commandments

Our Heavenly Father—our Creator—has a Personal Name. In Aramaic Square Script Hebrew it is: יהוה. In Paleo Hebrew Script it is יהוה. One transliterated version into English to help with sound pronunciation is “Yahuah,” additionally “Yah” for short—יה or יהו. Other English transliterations do exist.

Our Messiah—our Savior—has a Personal Name as well. Similarly in Aramaic it is written יהושע or יהושע in Paleo—transliterated to English by some as Yahusha. Other English transliterations do exist.

The Scriptures English Translation

Exodus 20:1 And Elohim spoke all these Words, saying,

Exodus 20:2 “I am יהוה your Elohim, who brought you out of the land of Mitsrayim, out of the house of slavery.

Exodus 20:3 “You have no other mighty ones against My face.

Exodus 20:4 “You do not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of that which is in the heavens above, or which is in the earth beneath, or which is in the waters under the earth,

Exodus 20:5 you do not bow down to them nor serve them. For I, יהוה your Elohim am a jealous Ėl, visiting the crookedness of the fathers on the children to the third and fourth *generations* of those who hate Me,

Exodus 20:6 but showing loving-commitment to thousands, to those who love Me and guard My commands.

Exodus 20:7 “You do not bring^a the Name of יהוה your Elohim to naught, for יהוה does not leave the one unpunished who brings His Name to naught. Footnote: ^aOr *lift up*, or *take*.

Exodus 20:8 “Remember the Sabbath day, to set it apart.

Exodus 20:9 “Six days you labour, and shall do all your work,

Exodus 20:10 but the seventh day is a Sabbath^b of יהוה your Elohim. You do not do any work – you, nor your son, nor your daughter, nor your male servant, nor your female servant, nor your cattle, nor your stranger who is within your gates. Footnote: ^bThere are other Sabbaths, but this is the weekly Sabbath.

Exodus 20:11 “For in six days יהוה made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day. Therefore יהוה blessed the Sabbath day and set it apart.

Exodus 20:12 “Respect your father and your mother, so that your days are prolonged upon the soil which יהוה your Elohim is giving you.

Exodus 20:13 “You do not murder.

Exodus 20:14 “You do not commit adultery.

Exodus 20:15 “You do not steal.

Exodus 20:16 “You do not bear false witness against your neighbour.

Exodus 20:17 “You do not covet your neighbour’s house, you do not covet your neighbour’s wife, nor his male servant, nor his female servant, nor his ox, nor his donkey, or whatever belongs to your neighbour.”

Deuteronomy 5:6 I am יהוה your Elohim who brought you out of the land of Mitsrayim, out of the house of bondage.

Deuteronomy 5:7 You have no other mighty ones against My face.

Deuteronomy 5:8 You do not make for yourself a carved image, any likeness of which is in the heavens above, or which is in the earth beneath, or which is in the waters under the earth,

Deuteronomy 5:9 you do not bow down to them nor serve them. For I, יהוה your Elohim, am a jealous Ėl, visiting the crookedness of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth *generations* of those who hate Me,

Deuteronomy 5:10 but showing loving-commitment to thousands, to those who love Me and guard My commands.

Deuteronomy 5:11 You do not bring^a the Name of יהוה your Elohim to naught, for יהוה does not leave him unpunished who brings His Name to naught. Footnote: ^aOr *lift up*, or *take*.

Deuteronomy 5:12 Guard the Sabbath day, to set it apart, as יהוה your Elohim commanded you.

Deuteronomy 5:13 Six days you labour, and shall do all your work,

Deuteronomy 5:14 but the seventh day is a Sabbath^b of יהוה your Elohim. You do not do any work – you, nor your son, nor your daughter, nor your male servant, nor your female servant, nor your ox, nor your donkey, nor any of your cattle, nor your stranger who is within your gates, so that your male servant and your female servant rest as you do. Footnote: ^bSee footnote at Exodus 20:10.

Deuteronomy 5:15 And you shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Mitsrayim, and that יהוה your Elohim brought you out from there by a strong hand and by an outstretched arm. Therefore יהוה your Elohim commanded you to perform the Sabbath day.

Deuteronomy 5:16 Respect your father and your mother, as יהוה your Elohim has commanded you, so that your days are prolonged, and so that it is well with you on the soil which יהוה your Elohim is giving you.

Deuteronomy 5:17 You do not murder.

Deuteronomy 5:18 You do not commit adultery.

Deuteronomy 5:19 You do not steal.

Deuteronomy 5:20 You do not bear false witness against your neighbour.

Deuteronomy 5:21 You do not covet your neighbour's wife, nor do you desire your neighbour's house, his field, nor his male servant, nor his female servant, his ox, nor his donkey, or whatever belongs to your neighbour.'
