PREDICTIONS

Man has always tried to predict the future, to pull back the veil that hides from us the way things will be next week, next month, next year.

Many of man's predictions have turned out to be false. Here are a few of them: King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella appointed a panel of Spanish sages to study Columbus' plans for a voyage to the Indies. They predicted that it couldn't possibly succeed. So many centuries after the creation, they said, there just couldn't be any more unexplored lands.

In the 19th century, when the railroad was invented, experts confirmed that people could not breathe on anything traveling at a speed of 30 miles per hour, and predicted that trains would kill all their passengers.

Shortly before the Wright brothers became famous a scientist wrote: "....no possible combination of known substances, known forms of machinery and known forms of force can be united in a practical flying machine." Just a week before the Wrights made their first flight an editorial in the New York <u>Times</u> suggested to one of their competitors that he might better turn his talents to "more useful employment."

Late in the 19th century, French historiam Emile Faguet predicted a bland 20th century. "The chances are that from now on history will be less filled with viscissitudes, less colorful, and less dramatic." he wrote. "The great conqueror, the great reformer, and the great statesman will become increasingly rare," he concluded. Since then have come Lenin, Mussolini, Stalin, Hitler, Wilson, Gandhi, Churchill, Franklin Roosevelt, General MacArthur, two world wars, many smaller wars, race riots, and other vicissitudes.

I suppose it would take a large library merely to list the predictions of men which have turned out to be false.

And yet, as we enter a new year, I, too, want to make some predictions. However, these "predictions" have an advantage over the predictions like those above, because I have an "inside source." No, not a special revelation from on High. But I do have God's Holy Word, the Bible, and on the basis of that I can make the following "predictions" for 1977:

- + During the next year, mankind will continue to sin, to rebel against God and His Law, to reject his Maker who wants all His human creatures to acknowledge Him as their God.
- + During the next year, God will continue to love all mankind, and through His Son Jesus Christ, will continue to forgive all of man's sins.
- During the next year, God's providential care will continue to uphold us, guiding our lives, protecting us in danger, guarding us from evil.

Lord, Who Do You Want Me to Love for You Today?

I'm reading a book about the gift of the Holy Spirit. The author calls the Holy Spirit the "Forgotten God" and asserts that many Christian churches today overlook or downplay this aspect of our triune God. While I'm not a Bible scholar and won't debate what other churches say, I recognize myself in some of the examples. I'm fortunate to have been raised in the Lutheran faith, where the gifts of the Holy Spirit are proclaimed. However, I am convicted of relying on my own knowledge, thoughts, and plans more than I should. What if I let go of that need for control and started each day with the simple prayer above?

I'm not one for New Year's resolutions, so I won't pose the challenge that way. I ask you to pray too. No matter your daily routine or commitments, will you ask God to show you who needs His love through you each day?

In our adult Bible class, we're studying how we show God's mercy as a congregation. This is another, more personal way to demonstrate His love and presence in our lives. Please join us each Sunday morning in January to see what opportunities He puts before us.

This spring, the congregation will elect or re-elect council leadership. My term as council president will end in June, and our bylaws do not allow me to serve another term. Please pray that God, through the Holy Spirit, will work in the heart of the congregation member who is to become our next leader and that person will come forward—maybe it's you?

When my term began in 2021, Ascension looked different than it does today. The next council president will face new challenges and the "headwinds" that today's culture places on the church, but I know they will not face them alone. The Holy Spirit is with us, and He gives us godly leaders who place serving the Lord above personal needs or gain.
