

DRAMAS AND SERMONS ON THE THEME "THE HOUR OF TRIAL"

Like all of us, the "Church" family has its problems. There are times when nothing goes right for Mr. and Mrs. Church and their son Frank, and their nerves become frayed. There is the problem about Grandma who should not be living alone. A dinner guest's flippant talk catches them off-guard. Hurt feelings disturb their relationship to the church.

These and other real life situations will be dealt with in the dramas and sermons entitled "The Hour of Trial," which will be presented in our special Lenten services this year.

What do the problems and irritations of daily life have to do with the Upper Room, Gethsemane, and Calvary? Our Lenten dramas and sermons will establish the connection. They will bring Christ to your dinner table. It will be your feet that He washes, your sins that He forgives, your hours of trial for which He prepares you.

The "Church" family has set a place for you at their table. They will not be hurt if you do not come. But you may be. It is for your frayed nerves that our Lord said, "Watch and pray."

Be in church every Wednesday evening during Lent to find strength in the Lord for the inescapable trials of life.

Olly, Olly, Oxen Free!

Do you remember shouting those words as a kid playing hide and seek? There were a lot of kids around the church where I grew up and we always preferred to play outdoors. Our church was on a corner lot with a big "front yard" space. When we played hide and seek, eventually we'd have to end the game and someone would shout these words to let us know it's ok to come out from our hiding places. With the cold temperatures and more than average snowfall, it feels like I've been stuck in the house for weeks – I'm ready to hear that it's time to come outdoors again.

When Pastor Dunn dismisses us from the communion rail, he pronounces his own message of freedom when he tells us "go in peace, you are free!" He reminds us that in Christ, we have been freed from sin and death. We don't have to barricade ourselves. Because of Christ, we can endure whatever comes our way. The outdoor thermometer reading may not be comfortable, the noise from the news may worry or disappoint, the prices in the grocery store may cause us to rethink the list but these are temporary things. The love we have as God's own child is bigger, brighter, warmer than any secular challenges and it's free because the debt was paid in blood by our Redeemer.

Many of us are life-long Lutherans and recognize these familiar, reassuring words. We think everyone knows them but guess what?!? That's no longer the case. Your neighbor, your co-worker, the server delivering your lunch – odds are high they haven't grown up hearing them. It's our turn to let people know they're loved by God. Most of us would be uncomfortable standing at the corner, shouting this news, but we can tell the world by our actions, by building relationships, showing compassion instead of anger. The gift of God's love is free and is for everyone.

There are several activities happening at church – easy opportunities to invite others to come along. Come to the Family Game Night on March 29 and invite friends.

Participate in our servant event at Harvesters on April 5 and bring someone with you. Invite a friend to join you for a home-cooked meal at church during one of our Lenten meals (served at Ascension on March 12 and April 17).

We are free! Share the good news!

Build up your "Prayer Muscles"

March 5, Ash Wednesday, is the start of Lent. The season lasts for 40 days (not counting Sundays) until we celebrate Easter on April 20.

From April 20 until May 29 is another 40-day stretch, the period after Easter, when we hear about the risen Lord meeting his disciples and others, preparing them for his ascension into heaven.

That's about 80 days for you to practice and strengthen your "prayer muscles" in preparation for Ascension's second annual "**Ascension Day of Prayer**" on Thursday, **May 29.** We will gather for prayer on that day. This workout doesn't involve warmups or require special shoes. The only gear you need is your Bible and maybe a prayer journal.

Prayer is time spent with God. Praise Him, cry out to Him, bring Him your cares and concerns, ask Him to comfort and heal others. The focus is on Him and the relationship He wants to have with you. It can be a few minutes or more but please plan to spend time EACH day – 4 simple steps:

- Present yourself to God in prayer
- Pray praise, ask in His name
- Read your Bible
- Listen for His response as you ponder what you've read

The Lord will bless us during this time.
