MAKE THIS A SON-FILLED SUMMER

A summer without the sun would be catestrophic. A week at the lake without the sun is sheer agony. An eclipse of the sun used to terrify the ancients. Without the light of the sun life would disappear from the earth.

But there is another light in the summer He is spelled S-O-N, the Son of God, the Light of the world, Jesus Christ. His Word is "A lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path." He warms our heart. He builds our life, He strengthens our faith, He enlightens our mind. He brings forgiveness for all our sins.

With the coming of summer we will be wanting to take off from church. We will be worshipping the "sun" but not the "Son." This ought not to be!

One of the secrets of the surrendered life is regular worship, $\underline{\text{even}}$ in the summer. Those who miss church are missing one of God's greatest gifts.

It is in church, through His Word and His Sacraments, that God comes to people with His law and gospel. It is in church that God's people come together regularly to adore and praise and thank Him! People may read His Word by themselves, of course; they may praise and thank Him by themselves. But it is reasonably sure that a person who neglects to hear God's Word in church on Sunday will also neglect to read His Word at home; if he or she doesn't thank Him in church on Sunday, he/she will not take time to thank Him much during the week.

There are good reasons for going to church, and bad ones. A person should go because to hear God's Word--in both the liturgy and the preaching. He goes to worship--to thank and praise God. He doesn't go to hear the word of the minister, or the music of the organist, or to be seen by people.

A committed Christian will not allow anything to keep him from church on Sunday. Only sickness or an emergency will keep him away. If he must work he makes it a point to go on his Sunday off, or whenever he has a chance on a weekday. For him, summer is not too hot to go, and winter is not too cold.

When you don't attend, you are missed! Your pastor misses you! Your fellow members miss you! And most important, God misses you! Don't be fooled--He knows when you are not in church.

God promises blessings upon those who hear His Word. He says, "Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and keep it." Note--in order to receive His blessing we must (1) hear His Word and (2) keep it.

I hope that this summer will be different for you. When you are not in church here, be in church at another Lutheran congregation.

Let your Sundays always be SONdays -- this summer and all year long!

How's your prayer life?

By the time this is published, our Ascension Day of Prayer 2025 will have taken place. We were asked to pray for hope, at least 4 times during the day. How did you do? Did you remember? Did you add a prayer of hope to your daily talk with God?

If our focus is on things of this world, there is little hope. Stories of politics, discord, inflation, tragedies, terrible storms vie for our attention, painting a bleak picture. Social media tells us people experience loneliness and depression in record numbers. Scrolling Facebook (which seems to gobble time like eating potato chips) shows others' lives who appear fuller, happier, prettier, younger than we are, making one feel "less than" or not good enough.

As the hymn says, He is the Lord of all hopefulness. He brings us bliss, strength, love, peace in our hearts – things that are opposite of the world's messages and also attributes that can turn a weary heart from despair to joy. It's as if God knew we would be bombarded with negative messages, and He provided a way for us to find welcome relief by connecting with Him through prayer.

Does it mean if we pray hard enough or in the right way, we won't be lonely, depressed, sad, frightened? No, the Bible doesn't say that at all. Jesus' words to the disciples are meant for us – "in this world you will have troubles. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33)

If you participated in our Ascension Day of Prayer, thank you. Thank you for taking your cares to Him. We know He hears us. If the request slipped your attention, take heart. Make today a day of prayer. Make every day a day of prayer.

Landscape Refresh

Our native plants around the sign have been blooming and growing. It brings a smile to my face every time I water. This little bit of updated landscaping is a cheerful note of welcome that will continue.

Check out the display in the narthex about other opportunities to refresh areas of our landscape, including the "stretch" goal of building a path from the parking lot to our church's front yard. We envision a gathering space and eventually the trail would connect all the way around the building. Ascension is known as the "church with the walker program" and this would be a great addition. We also have ideas about updating the landscaping at the entrance (potential butterfly garden) and renovating the prayer garden area between Fellowship Hall and the narthex (possibly a bird sanctuary). The west entrance to the Family Life Center needs updating and the main FLC entrance along the parking lot might be a great spot for lilies or other low-maintenance, sun-loving plants.

I don't mind taking on solitary projects, but I can't do these on my own! I hope to find other interested members who know more or want to learn about landscaping and caring for our outdoor space.
