

In the Garden

- Cut lavender for drying, choosing newly opened flowers for the best fragrance
- Give dahlias liquid feed, keep them well watered and tie the shoots of tall varieties to sturdy stakes as they grow
- Hoe and hand-weed borders often, so weeds don't have time to set seed
- Water and feed sweet peas regularly, pick the flowers every few days
- · Plant autumn bulbs including nerines, colchicums and sternbergia
- Feed, water and deadhead summer bedding in borders and baskets
- Cut back early summer perennials after flowering for a second flush
- Take softwood cuttings from shrubs, pyracantha, hydrangeas and spiraea
- Feed and deadhead roses to keep them flowering strongly
- · Keep watch for pests such as lily beetles, snails, aphids and vine weevils
- Pick off flowers on coleus plants to maintain their colourful leaves
- Sow biennials such as foxgloves, forget-me-nots and wallflowers
- Cut back geraniums and other summer perennials

At the Allotment

- Check crops such as runner beans regularly for aphids, and remove them
- Water thirsty plants such as celery, legumes, pumpkins and tomatoes
- Pick the last of the rhubarb and remove any flower spikes at the base
- Thin out crops of apples, pears and plums, remove undersized fruits
- Prune plum trees in dry weather, to avoid silver leaf fungal disease
- Sow a batch of peas and dwarf beans before mid-July for an autumn crop
- Shorten side shoots growing from the framework of trained fruit trees
- Water fruit trees and bushes, then lay a thick mulch of compost
- Peg down strawberry runners into pots of compost to root new plants
- Pick courgettes regularly so they don't turn into marrows
- Sow frequent small batches of fast-maturing salad leaves and radishes
- Cut down broad beans after harvesting, but leave the roots in the soil to release nitrogen as they decompose
- Protect brassicas from cabbage white butterflies with fine netting
- Continue pinching out any side shoots growing from the leaf joints of tomatoes



The Friends of Banham Church

I hope our many visitors enjoyed the Open Gardens this year, organised by the Friends of Banham Church (FOBC). You may be wondering who FOBC are and what they do.

FOBC was set up in 1998 "to support the fabric of St Mary's Church". This means making sure the Church is a building in good repair and with the amenities to make it a usable community space.

If you have come to the Saturday Cafe, Craft Fairs , Community Carol Concerts or Film Nights you will have benefitted from the funds raised by FOBC - as well as contributing to them.

Since 1998, FOBC has raised nearly £43,000. How has this money been used?

During this time there has been nearly £9,000 paid directly to support interior and exterior lighting and heating costs; major projects such as the £5,000 to the restoration fund in 2000; £2,514.50 for repairs to the clock in 2005; £6,000 for the glass doors in 2007; £3,730 for the projector and screen in 2016; as well as many smaller projects such as regilding the weather vane (£405); coffee-making equipment (£430.66) and a table tennis table for the Friday Club (£599).

People attend St Mary's for worship, weddings, funerals, a quiet place to sit and think, and for social events and entertainment. The local volunteers from FOBC who put time and effort into raising money to keep the building well-maintained and up-to-date (yes, even Wi-Fi is available!), as well as those who regularly clean, arrange the flowers and create other displays hope it will continue to be used and valued by the community for years to come.

The Society is registered as a Charitable Trust, thus ensuring its future and safeguarding its object, which is defined as: -

"To maintain, repair, restore, preserve, improve, beautify and reconstruct for the benefit of the public the fabric of the Church of St. Mary Virgin, Banham, its monuments, fixtures, fittings, furniture, stained glass, ornaments and other chattels."

Membership is open to anyone who supports the aims of the Society. The annual subscription, at present £10 a year, entitles the members to join in the running of the Society. An annual newsletter is published to keep members informed of its activities. At present, in addition to the annual general meeting, there are regular film evenings, bi-annual Open Gardens and the Community Choir, organised to bring members together and to raise funds for the Friends of Banham Church.







Parish Council News

May 2025

The May meeting of the Banham Parish Council took place on Thursday 15th May 2025. This included the annual meeting followed by the general meeting.

In attendance at the meeting was Mr Jeff Burrell (Chairman), Mr Brendan Sparks, Mrs Pam Spicer, Dr Jo Dalton, and Michelle Jones (Parish Clerk).

The Parish Council discussed the speed limit on Grove Road following concerns raised by a resident. Upon receiving the concerns the Parish Council contacted Highways to see if the speed limit could be reduced when considering the addition of new houses located there in recent years. Unfortunately Highways advised that Grove Road does not meet the necessary criteria to warrant a speed limit reduction, and so the Parish Council are now looking into ways that it may be able to fund speed reductions strategies themselves. This will be discussed again at the next meeting, with a further update to follow.

We are proud to have been able to assist with the funding of a residential school trip for the Banham Primary School, along with giving a donation towards the Forest School area following the recent vandalism.

Recipe of the Month

Pavlova

Ingredients for the meringue:-

3 egg whites 60z (175g) caster sugar 1 teaspoon cornflour ½ teaspoon vanilla essence 1 teaspoon lemon juice

Ingredients for the topping:-

½ pint whipping or double cream any fruit you like. I like a selection of berries – strawberries, raspberries and blueberries



Cooking time 1 to 1 ¼ hrs at 150 Celsius or gas mark 2

Instructions:-

Cover a baking tray in greaseproof or parchment paper. Whisk the egg whites until very stiff and dry. Whisk in half the sugar and continue whisking until the mixture is stiff and shiny. Sieve the remaining sugar with the cornflour and fold into the mixture with the vanilla essence and lemon iuice.

Spread the meringue onto the greaseproof/parchment paper in the shape of a circle. Bake in the centre of a low oven for 1 to 1 ½ hrs until firm and delicately coloured. Turn off the over and put a wooden spoon in the oven door to let the oven cool slowly with the Pavlova still inside which should help prevent cracking.

Once cooled remove greaseproof/parchment paper off of the back of the Pavlova. Place on a plate. Whip the cream and cover the top of the Pavlova with the cream and then decorate with fresh fruit.

This is a wonderful summer pudding. Enjoyed by everyone that tastes it. It's been a speciality of mine for many years. I make it for birthdays and parties. It's a great recipe to have when getting together with family and friends as you can make the meringue in advance and just add the cream and fruit shortly before serving. Try it and enjoy it!

Feline Care - A Hidden Haven for Cats in Need

Our site itself is a peaceful refuge. Purpose-built pens offer temporary accommodation to cats awaiting adoption, providing them with comfort and security during what can be a stressful transition. In addition to these rehoming areas, the sanctuary is also home to cats who prefer the freedom of outdoor life. These residents roam the grounds year-round, living in harmony with nature within the boundaries that keep them safe from harm.

Feline Care does more than just house cats, we actively work to prevent suffering in the wider feline population. Through our Trap-Neuter-Release (TNR) programme, the team humanely traps unneutered feral or stray cats, has them spayed or castrated and microchipped, and then returns them to their familiar territory. This approach not only helps to control the population of unwanted litters but also improves the quality of life for community cats. We are also able to offer neutering for domestic cats, please have a look at our website for more details.

Adoption is a central pillar of our work. Each cat is thoroughly assessed to find the most suitable home, and the adoption process is designed to match pets and people perfectly. As many of the cats in our care have had difficult backgrounds or have already been through multiple homes, finding their forever home is our highest priority. The team is always eager to speak with prospective adopters and share the unique stories and personalities of the cats in our care.

In addition to rescue and rehoming efforts, the sanctuary also offers subsidised microchipping services for just £5, a small fee for peace of mind. Microchipping greatly increases the chance of a lost cat being reunited with its family, and we encourage all pet owners to take advantage of this vital service.

History Lesson - Banham's Pub's

Episode 3 – The Brickmakers Arms (Queens Head)

There was a pub situated at Hunts Corner from c1851 to 1951. It was known as the **Queens Head** until c1877 and thereafter the **Brickmakers Arms.** It is now a private residence called Kiln House. One of the licensees was Jonathon Hunt, a brickmaker, and this business gave Hunts Corner its name.

All licensees were very industrious, holding a second trad, George Holl was a watchmaker, Roger Nudds was a carpenter, Thomas Gibson was a farmer, George Robinson just relied on his earnings as a publican for 34 years until he died, still in harness at age 81.

Mrs Robinson sold the household furniture and outdoor effects by auction, Saturday 7th April 1951. Breweries: Youngs, Crawshay and Youngs.



Coroners' inquests were often held in local pubs. There is a record that in 1943 the inquest into the death of Alfred Clare Smith (55), horseman of Overcroft, Banham, was held here. Mr. Smith was involved in a collision with a lorry whilst cycling on the afternoon of Monday 18th October 1943.
