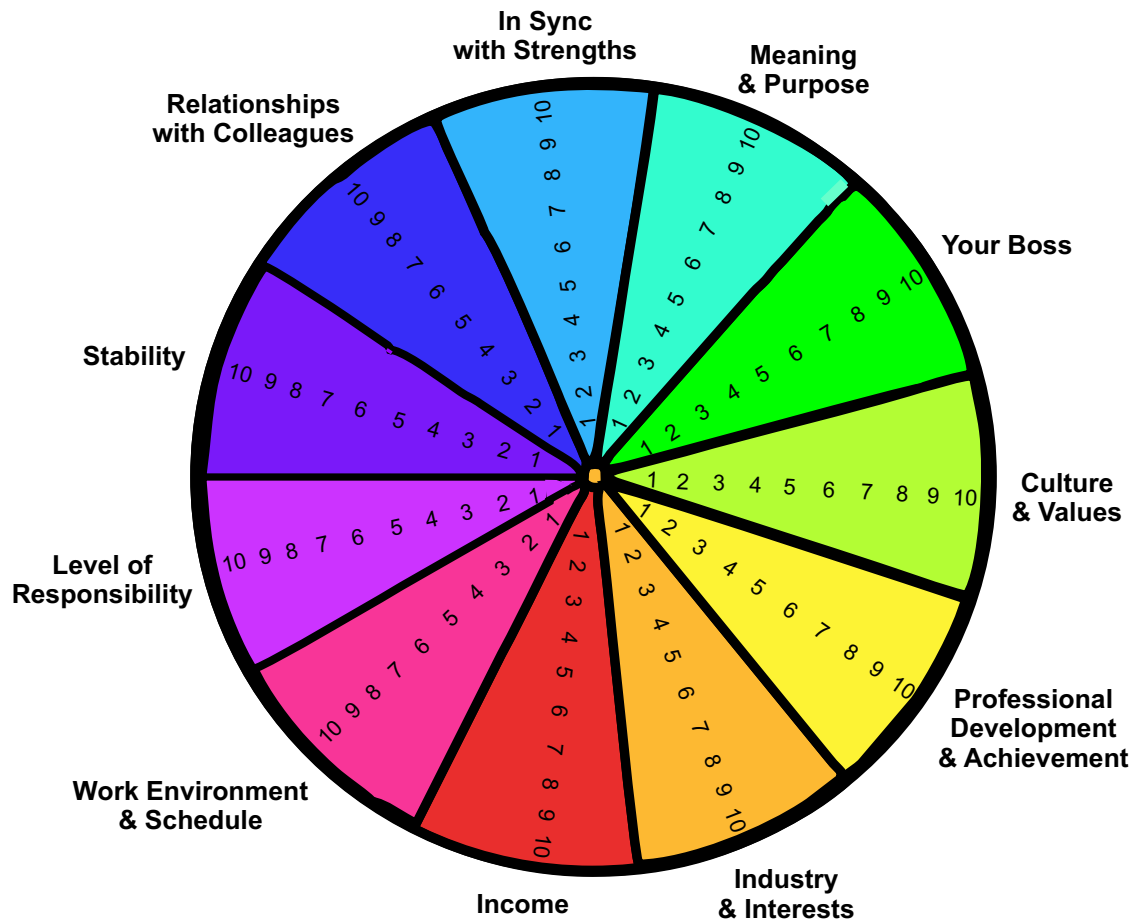


Career Satisfaction Assessment
