SOUTH SUDAN EMERGENCY

Extermination of Civilians Follows Campaign to Delegitimize Local Resistance

Over the past week, the government of South Sudan has carried out a **systematic and horrific bombing campaign against civilians**, using **incendiary weapons in nighttime airstrikes** on unsuspecting men, women, and children. This **escalation of violence** follows a deliberate effort by the Juba administration to **demonize local youth defending their families** from military aggression.

From Misinformation to Mass Murder

For weeks, South Sudanese government officials and their allies **spread false claims** that the Nuer-based **White Army**—a loosely organized youth militia that has historically protected villages from state-backed attacks—was a **terrorist group**. This narrative, despite lacking any basis in fact, was **weaponized as a pretext to justify mass killings**.

On **16 March 2025**, after successfully framing local resistance as a security threat, the government launched a **brutal series of aerial attacks on civilian areas in Nasir, Ulang, Longuchuk, and Mabaan counties**. These bombings, carried out under **direct orders from President Salva Kiir**, used **incendiary and chemical weapons, including ethyl acetate-filled bombs**.

The results are **catastrophic**:

- **Hundreds of civilians are dead**, burned alive in their homes as they slept.
- **Women and children make up a large portion of the casualties**.
- **Hospitals are overwhelmed** with mass casualties, many suffering from severe burns.
- **Entire villages have been reduced to ashes** by the bombings.

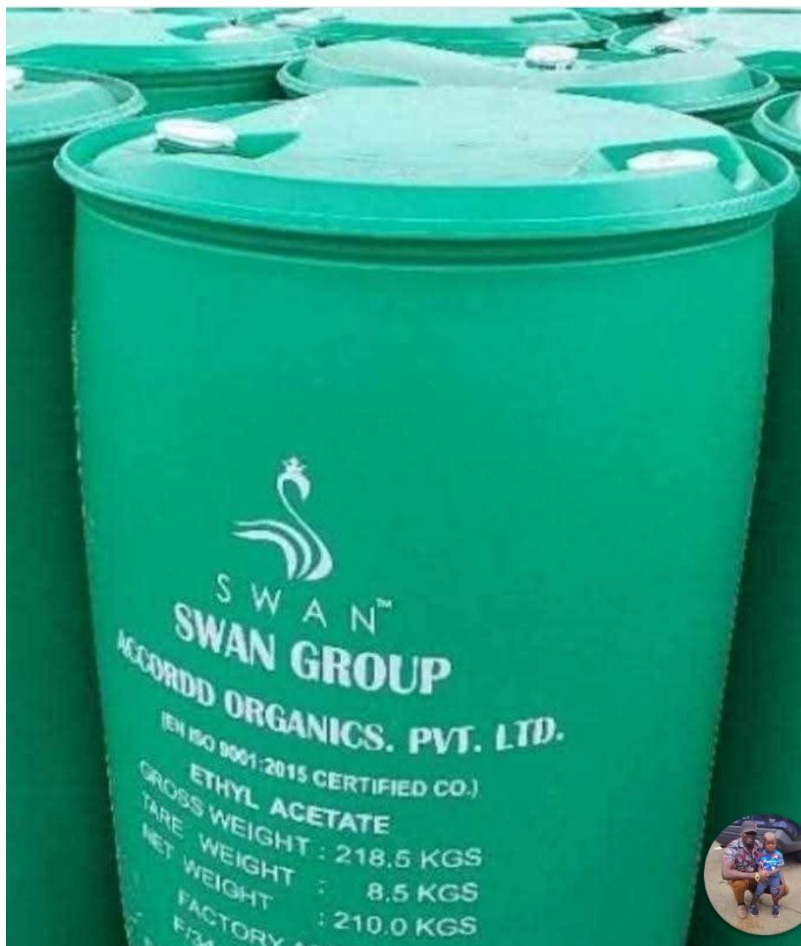

The Tactics of Ethnic Cleansing

This is not just a war crime—it is **a deliberate act of ethnic cleansing**. The South Sudanese government's **strategy is clear**:

1. **Delegitimize local resistance** by branding those defending their homes as "terrorists."
2. **Secure international backing** or silence by spreading misinformation.
3. **Unleash military force**, using incendiary and chemical weapons to exterminate opposition.

This cycle is tragically **not new**. The same government forces that massacred **thousands of Nuer civilians in Juba in December 2013** are once again **targeting entire communities under the guise of counterterrorism**.

As in 2013 the Juba government has called in the Ugandan Army to support their war crimes.

International Inaction Equals Complicity

Despite mounting evidence of **atrocities, the African Union (AU), IGAD and the United Nations have failed to act decisively**. The **AU Peace and Security Council** is set to discuss South Sudan's situation on **18 March 2025**, yet the government remains **unfazed** by international condemnation.

The **global community must take action NOW**:

- **Condemn these bombings as war crimes and crimes against humanity.**
- **Demand an immediate halt to airstrikes and other attacks on civilians.**
- **Call for an independent international investigation into these atrocities.**
- **Impose immediate sanctions** on those responsible for these mass killings, including military commanders and political leaders in Juba.

A Call to Conscience

The world **cannot look away**. The images emerging from South Sudan tell the story of a **government waging war against its own people—burning women and children alive, reducing villages to charred remains, and silencing survivors through terror.**

We demand justice. We demand action. We demand an end to this slaughter.
