Find a devotional partner/partners and meet up regularly to discuss your experiences and journaled answers (*the parts you're comfortable sharing, of course*). This is a wonderful opportunity to cheer each other on, pray for, and minister into each other's lives.

Introduction



Daughters of Destiny is an invitation to journey through the lives of remarkable individuals whose courage, faith, and obedience shaped history. And though the Bible holds many such marvelous and diverse figures, in the pages of this single book, I've chosen to highlight these following seven women:

2.Deborah	1200 BC	Judge and prophetess; led Israel to victory
3.Jael	1200 BC	Killed Sisera, fulfilling Deborah's prophecy
4.Ruth	1100 BC	Moabite widow; loyal to Naomi; great-grandmother of David
5.Esther	480 BC	Ordinary Jewish girl turned queen of Persia; saved her people from a decree of genocide
6.Mary	18 BC	Mother of Jesus; model of faith and obedience
7.Priscilla	50 AD	Early church teacher; partnered with Aquila and Paul

Seren Women, One Story of Redemption



1. RAHAB – From Harlot to Heroine

Once a prostitute in Jericho, Rahab's faith in the God of Israel led her to hide the spies and hang a scarlet cord from her window (a powerful symbol of salvation). Her story (Joshua 2) is a stunning portrait of redemption: from outsider to ancestor of Jesus (Matthew 1:5). Rahab reminds us that faith can redeem any past and open the way to God's purpose.

2. DEBORAH – Wise Warrior

As a prophetess and judge, Deborah led Israel with wisdom and courage. Under her guidance, Barak defeated Sisera, fulfilling God's promise (Judges 4–5). Her song of victory still echoes today: "*March on, my soul; be strong!*" (—Judges 5:21, NIV); reminding us that true spiritual authority can be exercised with humility and faith.

3. Jael – Unexpected Deliverer

In a moment of unexpected opportunity, Jael drove a tent peg through Sisera's temple (Judges 4:21). Her act was bold and decisive, fulfilling God's prophecy and bringing deliverance to Israel. She wasn't a soldier, just a woman with courage and faith. Jael reminds us that God can use anyone, anywhere, to accomplish His purposes.

4. RUTH – Loyal Sojourner

A Moabite widow who clung to Naomi with the words, "*Your people will be my people, and your God my God*" (Ruth 1:16, NIV). Ruth gleaned in the fields, waited patiently in faith, and became the great-grandmother of King David. Her story is a quiet unfolding of God's providence, reminding us that loyalty and love endure.

5. ESTHER – Courageous Intercessor

A Jewish orphan who became queen, Esther risked her life to save her people: *"If I perish, I perish"* (Esther 4:16, NIV). Her story is one of divine positioning, showing that God places us *"for such a time as this"* (Esther 4:14). She teaches us that influence is a gift to be used faithfully for the good of others.

6. MARY – Willing Vessel

A young girl from Nazareth, Mary responded to the angel Gabriel with quiet surrender: *"I am the Lord's servant. May it be to me as you have said"* (Luke 1:38, NIV). Though her calling came with scandal and sorrow, she bore the Savior of the world with grace and faith. Her life reminds us that obedience often requires trusting God before fully understanding His plan.

7. PRISCILLA – Faithful Teacher

Priscilla – alongside her husband, Aquila – partnered closely with Paul in his ministry, actively helping to spread the Gospel in Corinth and beyond (Acts 18). She is one of the few women in Scripture explicitly recognized as a teacher of God's Word. Combined with hospitality, leadership, and her willingness to follow where God would lead, Priscilla's life demonstrates how faithful service can advance His kingdom.

Day 1 🌿 *a woman in jericho*

The Unfolding Story of Rahab

In the bustling city of Jericho, surrounded by towering walls and the hum of constant activity, lived a woman named Rahab. Rahab's Unyielding Courage

When the moment arrived, Rahab guided the spies to the rooftop of her house. With quiet urgency, she tucked them beneath the bundles of flax. Below, the footsteps of the king's soldiers echoed ominously, drawing nearer with each passing second. Yet, amidst the encroaching darkness, Rahab's heart remained grounded in a belief that had only just begun to bloom.

With a serene countenance, she greeted the soldiers at her door, her eyes a calm ocean betraying no trace of the tempest within. *"Yes, the men were here earlier,"* she admitted, her voice steady and unhurried, *"but I didn't know where they were from. They left the town at dusk, as the gates were about to close. I don't know where they went. If you hurry, you can probably catch up with them."*

With deliberate ease, she sent the soldiers on a frantic chase into the wilderness – their torches soon dancing in the distance, flickering like fireflies swallowed by the night sky.

Rahab's Pact: A Covenant in the Stillness

The spies, moved by Rahab's courage and faith, agreed to the terms she had boldly laid out. As they prepared to slip away, they gave her a solemn instruction: to tie a scarlet cord in the window of her house. This simple thread would serve as a sacred sign – a mark of protection when the Israelites returned to conquer Jericho, ensuring the safety of all within.

A Symbol of Redemption

After the spies left, Rahab tied the scarlet cord in her window, just as they had agreed. As the crimson thread slipped through her fingers, she felt a quiet surge of hope rise within her. This was more than just a signal; it was a testament to her belief in a God she was only beginning to know. Day 6 🌿 *a time of oppression*

Between Desolation and Deliverance
