PhiLanSci UAM 2026

(2nd International Conference for Early-Career Researchers in Philosophy and the Sciences of Language) Guest Country: Italy

Dear PhD Candidates,

On **27, 28, and 29 May 2026**, the **PhiLanSci UAM 2026** (International Conference for Early-Career Researchers in Philosophy and Language Sciences) will be held in the Assembly Hall of the Faculty of Philosophy and Letters at the Autonomous University of Madrid (UAM).

In this second edition, **Italy will be the guest country**, and at the beginning of each session we will have the pleasure of listening to internationally renowned professors, both Italian and Spanish.

This call is addressed to PhD candidates enrolled in the PhD Programme in Philosophy and Language Sciences at UAM and is also open to paper and poster submissions from colleagues at other universities in the Madrid region, across Spain, and from any university worldwide—with particular interest in public Italian universities—who are enrolled in similar programmes. A space for four presentations will be reserved for UAM Master's students during the event. Given the international nature of the conference, **at least 25%** of participating PhD candidates will come from non-Spanish universities.

The event will maintain the hybrid format of the first edition: in-person attendance for PhD candidates from universities in the Madrid region, and online participation for international attendees and Spanish participants from universities outside the region who are unable to travel. The conference will also be open to the general public, as one of its core aims is to promote open and accessible Humanities and Sciences. For this reason, we will value contributions that are professionally written yet engaging and accessible.

Audience members who are currently enrolled in undergraduate, Master's, or PhD programmes will receive a certificate of attendance, provided they register through the online form and sign the attendance sheet in the room. Presenters and poster authors must attend **at least two of the six sessions** to receive a presenter certificate, while audience members must attend a **minimum of three sessions** to obtain a certificate of attendance.

There will be two daily sessions: from **09:30 to 13:30 (with a break at 12:00)** and from **15:30 to 20:00 (with a break at 17:30)**.

PROPOSALS

Presentations will have an approximate duration of 15 minutes, followed by a brief Q&A session. As this is an international conference, presentations in both English and Spanish are welcome (we will provide Spanish–English interpretation for international attendees).

POSTERS

Posters are welcome and will be displayed in the Assembly Hall of the Faculty throughout the three days of the Conference. Participants may present a poster without giving a talk, but poster authors must attend, like speakers, a minimum of two sessions of the event. Printing and shipping costs will be covered by the participants. Posters may be delivered in person (at the reception desk of the Faculty of Philosophy) for those living near the UAM. Poster size: **DIN A1** (approx. 59.4 × 84.1 cm), **vertical format**. Posters will not be mailed back under any circumstances, but they may be collected in person on the last day of the conference in the Assembly Hall. Posters not collected will remain for one week at the Faculty reception for their owners; after that period, they will be discarded.

Proposals for papers must be submitted in a Word document before 22 March, preferably through the event website www.philansci.es, where a specific submission box will be enabled, or —only if there is a technical issue with the website— by email to philansci.confe@uam.es (**messages will be accepted only from institutional email accounts**). Submissions must indicate the research line to which the paper or poster belongs and must include **a title, an abstract** (min. 600 and max. 800 words + basic bibliography), **and a short academic bio of no more than five lines**. Once all submissions have been evaluated, the selection of proposals will be communicated to participants before 15 April, allowing sufficient time to finalise the programme and prepare the presentations.
