

#### Gina Jogan on Botanical Design Plaques and Collages

Gina Jogan is a National Garden Club Accredited Master Flower Show Judge, an NGC Flower Show Schools Instructor in Design



and Flower Show Procedure, as well as an NGC Symposia Instructor in Design and Allied Topics. As a member of the NGC Flower Show Schools Committee, she served as a chair of Student Schedules, New Designs, and FSP Instructors. She is a member and presenter for CFAA (Creative Floral Arrangers of

America) and OFAD (Organization of Floral Arts Designers). She is also an active member on the regional, State, and local levels holding numerous positions and receiving prestigious awards including, Florida Federation of Garden Clubs': Hall of Fame, Calendar Girl and Guardian of Gardening. Her designs have been published in articles, magazines, calendars and on-line. Gina Jogan will be presenting on the Botanical Arts Division's Botanical Design Section, specifically College and Plaque Designs. The Botanical Arts Division in a Standard Flower Show or Specialty Show allows for additional types of Horticulture, Design and other art-like exhibits (including Photography) that are not included in regular Horticulture and Design Divisions. This allows for more opportunities for exhibiting and creativity within a variety of sections.

Within the Botanical Designs Section, there are five design types. Gina will be focusing on Bonded Designs, designs affixed to a surface. The two designs within this type are Collages and Plaques. Collage Designs are abstract designs. These are opposites to Plaque Designs which are created in a more natural manner.

These two distinctive designs provide an interesting contrast of styles which also have the advantage of capitalizing on vertical space, a real plus when staging a flower show.

This is an FGCNYS Judges Council presentation and open to all FGCNYS Convention attendees.



#### Rosemary Eshghi

#### Increasing and Maintaining Membership



Rosemary Eshghi was invited to the Chappaqua Garden Club Holiday Party in December 2010 and was introduced to a lovely woman who became her sponsor when she joined the Club a few months later.

At the time, she knew nothing about gardening but has since taken a few courses in landscape design and

environment, and one course of the flower show school. All NGC Schools are well worth the time, with the dividend of getting to know more fellow gardeners.

Two years later, Rosemary became the Club president and eventually got to know many women in District IX by attending District meetings.

In 2015, she became Assistant Director of District IX for two terms under Carol Della Femina and after that, Director for two terms. She now serves as the Membership chairman in the FGCNYS.

### Historical Highlights Federated Garden Club of New York State By Nancy Kalieta

Under the direction of Mrs. John Paris, 43 people representing 20 organized garden clubs met in February 1924 to discuss forming a federation. The federation was formed with 12 charter clubs (12 more joined 3 months later) for the purpose of supporting its members. The first Annual Meeting was held at the Roosevelt Hotel in NYC in 1925. In 1929, the National Council of State Garden Club Federation, Inc. was formed. (The name was later changed to National Garden Clubs, Inc. in 1999). New York was a charter member with 12,500 members.

A New York state seal designed by Frederick LeRoy Sargent of Harvard was used for the first time on the cover of the 1927 yearbook. It features the rose, the state flower of New York, surrounded by laurel and olive branches symbolizing fame and achievement. For many years, presidents have worn a solid gold replica of our seal. The incumbent president is the only person who may wear this pin which is presented at the installation. A Federation Former President pin, a much smaller version, is presented to each outgoing president.

In 1931, FGCNYS hosted the first course in judging flower shows with 153 people from 11 states in attendance. The federation published pamphlets on "Notes for Judging Amateur Flower Shows" to use in the judging. The pamphlets were used as a basis for the "Handbook for Flower Shows" published by NGC in 1942. As NGC began to add courses such as gardening/horticulture (1950), landscaping (1958), and environmental (1976), the federation was quick to become involved. Over the years many of these schools have been offered and enjoyed. As the clubs under the leadership of the federation became more involved in various activities, an award program was established (1937). Awards are given in a variety of areas. NGC began a scholarship program in 1952. The FGCNYS also established a scholarship program for students entering college to study in a field related to gardening or the natural world. Blue Star markers, began in 1946, have been placed all over the state to honor our fallen service men and women. Numerous markers exist in all ten districts.

#### Historical Highlights cont'd Federated Garden Club of New York State By Nancy Kalieta

Community involvement became as important a focus as educating its members. Youth Programs were started in the 1930s and are continued today. The goals being to teach children basic gardening skills, instill a deep appreciation for the natural world, and a real concern for the environment. World Gardening was started in 1959 to build bridges of friendship to the less fortunate. Today the clubs of the FGCNYS donate generously to "Water for South Sudan" or "Dig Deep". The concept behind Garden Therapy (1959) is to work with patients in an activity related to gardening or horticulture. Although the program was originally planned for veterans' hospitals, its scope has been extended to include the blind, handicapped children, and those in homes for the elderly.

The FGCNYS survived through difficult times in history. During World War II, garden clubs across the country educated people on how to produce food for a nation at war. Victory Gardens became prevalent to not only provide food but to offer hope for a better future. Perhaps one of the most difficult times for New York was 9/11. The FGCNYS was meeting at the Otesaga Hotel for their fall conference. After the initial shock of the disaster, Donna Pair, President, said that they should continue with the meeting on schedule as it was important to keep things as normal as possible. That same call for normalcy was evident during the Covid-19 crisis in 2020. Vikki Bellias, President and Linda Zell, the office manager, learned how to use Zoom to create a site for meetings and lectures, and quickly taught us all. Clubs also met outdoors, some sewed masks, and others had food drives. The federation survived another crisis.

The FGCNYS presently includes 181 clubs with over 6,000 members. It is divided into 10 districts. There have been 47 former presidents of the federation. A few have been willing to share their thoughts on what it was like to be part of the FGCNYS:

#### Historical Highlights cont'd Thoughts from Former Presidents

#### **Joan Corbisiero (1991-1993)**

I remember very fondly my trips to the Albany Office nearly every week, accompanied by my friend and then Treasurer, Connie Bishop. The special project of my administration was a horticulture one, which I'm sure is no surprise to anyone who knows me. It was the planting of Elm trees in the State, in an attempt to fight their extinction by the Dutch Elm disease. I wonder today if any of those trees are still around.

#### Patricia Cargnoni (1993-1995)

My theme for my two years was "TOGETHER WE CAN"... and together WE DID! The NCSGC (later changed to NGC) project for State Presidents was to develop a project under the auspices of Shell Oil Co.to educate the public and implement safe environmental practices in our communities. Ours was INTO THE SEWER drawing attention to contaminating ground water. We won the very generous monetary award. I am honored to have been a part of our Federation leadership during this time of development and dedication.

#### Barbara Campbell (2005-2007)

"Many things happen in a term. One program was to honor relatives of those serving by giving them red geraniums on Memorial Day. We contributed \$12,000 to the World Gardening project in Haiti. A manual was written for "Officers and Chairman". Great memories."

#### **Monica Hansen (2017-2019)**

"Being president made me realize that without our garden clubs there would be no need for our state organization. And as I traveled around our state and met so many of our members (putting 34,844 miles on my car in one year) I felt it even more strongly. As we join to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our Federation, I am so proud to be a part of our history."

#### Vikki Bellias (2019-2021)

"During my term Covid hit. The experience necessitated a shutdown of our activities. But our very smart garden club members were resourceful and adapted to the situation. It sure was rewarding to see how everyone pulled together."

#### Lynne Arnold (2021-2023)

"When I began my road to the presidency, it fulfilled one of my most pleasant past times, that of travel. I stayed and visited many gardens and historic homes across NY, when I attended state meetings and symposiums. When I became president, I enjoyed meeting the other state presidents from CAR-SGC. I felt proud to represent NY state at the National Convention."

In conclusion, the Federated Garden Clubs of New York State has been fortunate to have dedicated, hardworking, creative leaders and members over the past 100 years. It takes all of us to work together to keep this organization viable and effective now and in the future. The future depends on you.

New York was one of the first states to form a federation, to have books in Braille, to establish Judges' Schools, and the first to print a Handbook for Flower Show Judges. The Federation cooperated with Gardens on Parade at the 1939 World's Fair and has taken part in the International Flower Show.


