While kids can be cruel and Mama seal considered keeping Psychedelic in home school to protect him, Papa seal said – no. If we


bring him up to be proud of his differences, and teach him to be physically and




emotionally strong – one day it will pay off. Cruel taunts don't always stop when kids grow up, Papa seal reminded Mama seal.

The family went about a program of physical and emotional training that in fact helped them all become better seals.




Physically they swam long distances, dove deep in the ocean regularly, and Papa and Psychedelic practiced sparring until he got very good.



Emotionally and cognitively they practised meditating, debating, and reading philosophy texts from the ancients.


The family also engaged in long discussions around the dinner table about seal rights, environmental concerns, and dealing with discrimination among other important topics.






