Please wear a mask during distribution at the park.

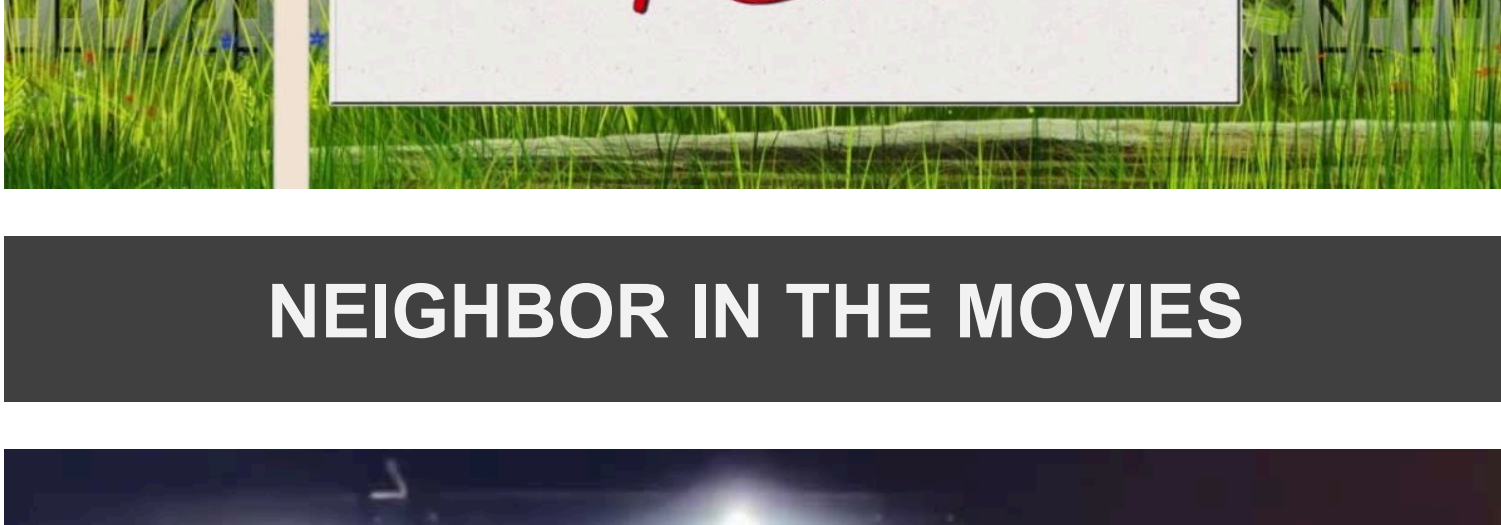

Rotary BBQ – October 3, 2020, Noon to 7 p.m. – Gross Funeral Home Parking Lot

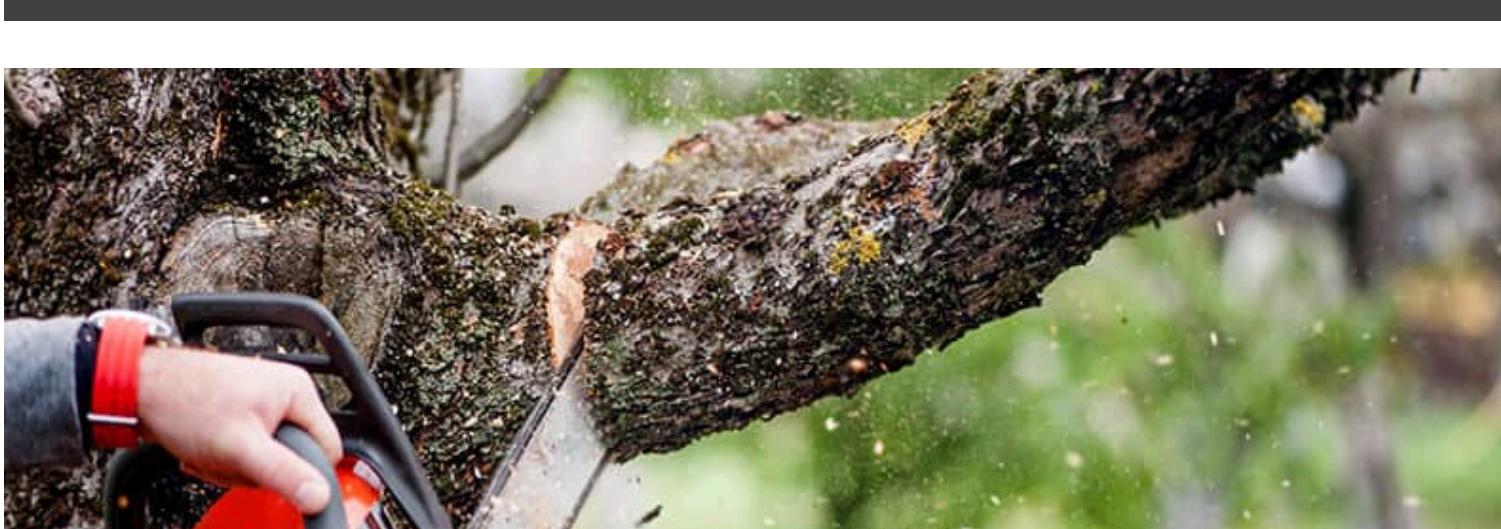

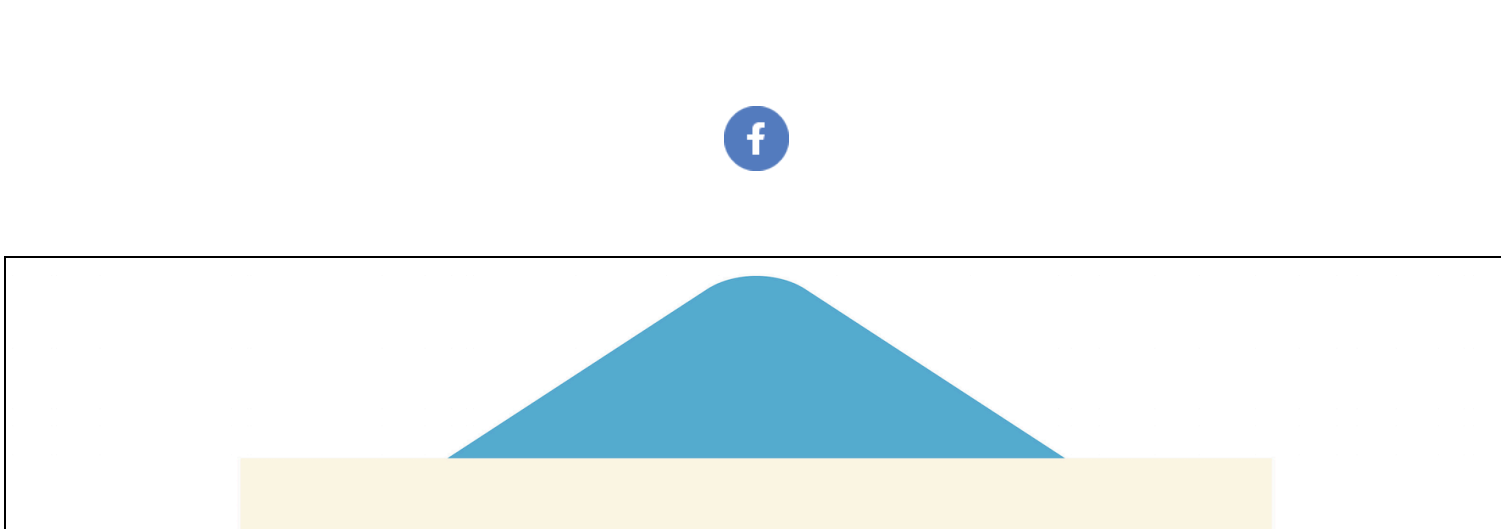
TREE MAINTENANCE



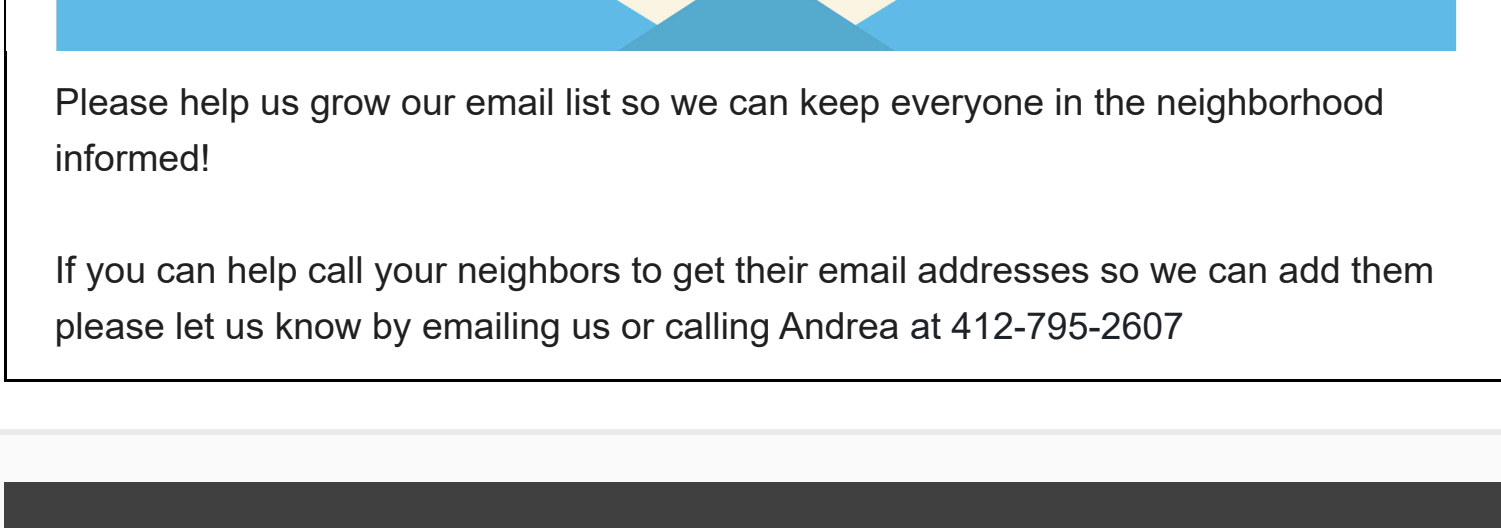

Please be a good neighbor by inspecting your trees and have them removed if they show signs of disease which could spread to other trees, or of advanced age which could cause them to fall. Be considerate of neighbors by removing overhanging branches that could fall and damage property. If your tree does damage to another property, be a good neighbor by offering to help with clean-up and to share any incurred expenses.
