NEW ITEMS IN PARK MUSEUM

The State Park Office and Visitors Center at 1100 Pine Grove Road includes a one-room museum, sometimes overlooked since it is "around the corner" past the public information desk and our merchandise sales area. We are grateful to recent donors for contributing multiple cast iron objects including two stoves, pots, and a teakettle that expand the collection and allow better interpretation of ironmaking at Pine Grove Furnace. Here are a few of the newly displayed artifacts.

• "Peter Ege Pine Grove" ten-plate wood-burning stove, cast at our furnace around 1836 •





This is one of a pair originally installed in Christ Church Episcopal Chapel on Main Street (Route 94) in York Springs in Adams County. It was donated in September to the Friends of Pine Grove Furnace State Park by the Episcopal Diocese of Central Pennsylvania (former owner of the chapel) and Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in York Springs (new owner of the chapel in late 2022). Because it was intended to heat the congregation, not for cooking, the oven bake doors were never installed. The artwork is very similar but not identical to the large stove previously displayed in the center of the park museum. The theme is "Be Liberty Thine" with an angel, trumpet, and 13 stars representing the original U.S. states, a common motif in castings from Pine Grove Furnace well into the 19th century. Do not miss another, smaller Pine Grove stove from about 1810-1815 with a "sunburst" motif, also newly installed in the museum.

Cast iron teakettle, probably made at Pine Grove Furnace



This household item, rarely seen today, was likely made at our blast furnace, circa 1780-1810. This specific artifact is shown on page 102 of John Tyler's 2014 book, *Early American Cast Iron Holloware: Pots, Kettles, Teakettles, and Skillets 1645-1900* (sold by the Friends in the State Park Office) The teakettle was intended to boil water to pour over loose tea in a cup – it did not hold tea leaves directly.

Tyler observes that teakettles were difficult to make (due to the curving spout) and not cast in large numbers. For example, in 1786, Pine Grove's skilled molders cast 3,351 pots, 335 kettles, and 1,743 Dutch ovens, but only 109 teakettles.

IMPROVING MOUNTAIN CREEK IN THE PARK

Volunteers organized by the Michaux Forest Association (MFA) – an organization of cabin owners in our State Park and surrounding Michaux State Forest – have been working along Mountain Creek where it flows past Fuller Lake. This ongoing effort seeks to create a healthy "riparian buffer" from the beach upstream towards the furnace area. Volunteers have removed numerous invasive plants and planted native species including more than two dozen trees, while also picking up garbage. The MFA project is supported by a grant from Giant Foods and a \$2,000 donation from the Friends of Pine Grove Furnace. We are happy to use the money we raise from firewood and merchandise sales, public donations, and park special events to help our neighbors in this worthy cause! This year, in addition to supporting the MFA project, our Friends group also bought 15 hickory trees for \$990 that were planted in the park's Organized Group Tenting Area during National Public Lands Day.
