GRANT AWARDED TO IMPROVE MOUNTAIN CREEK TRAIL

The Cumberland Valley Visitors
Bureau announced on November 4
that the Friends of Pine Grove
Furnace State Park has been
awarded a grant of \$21,730 to cover
a portion of the costs to improve
the Mountain Creek Trail and build
a fifty-foot bridge across the
stream. Once completed, the 1.72
mile trail will provide an easy hike
between the Laurel Lake and Fuller
Lake areas of the park.

The Mountain Creek Trail Project was one of 16 grants funded by the Cumberland Area Economic Development Corporation.

The first step will be to clear away a number of large fallen trees and

replace old crossings over boggy areas on the trail. We will need volunteers for much of the work, so stay tuned!

The Friends group will work closely with the new park manager to finalize plans before beginning trail improvements next spring.

At the same event, it was announced that Pine Grove Furnace State Park was voted as the 2016 Best in the Valley for Outdoor Attraction by the Cumberland County Visitors Bureau. Each year, residents, visitors and businesses vote for the best attractions in the county.

We have just learned that Joe Basil will be replacing Sean at the end of November. Joe is currently the assistant operations manager of Hill's Creek State Park. Please join us in welcoming Joe to the park!

Fall Furnace Fest: In spite of the unseasonably cold weather, more than 6,300 people turned out for the 7th Annual Fall Furnace Fest. Cindy Dunn, Secretary of DCNR, led the pumpkin parade from the Furnace Stack pavilion to Fuller Lake for the traditional pumpkin

float and the legend of the Hairy Hand.

Volunteers: It was a record year for volunteer involvement in the park. During the twelve month season ending on September 1, volunteers clocked in more than 6,000 hours of service to the park. That equates to more than 160 weeks of donated work!

Firewood: Meanwhile, volunteers kept in shape splitting firewood to sell to campers in the park. We

raised more than \$7,000 from firewood sales this year. All sales proceeds stay at the park.

New Play Area: You may have noticed the new playground and swing set installed this summer between Fuller Lake beach and the Brickyard restroom building. This second playground at Pine Grove Furnace was purchased by the Friends in 2015 and installed by park staff. A third playground near Laurel Lake is in our long-range plans.
