Koppenhaver/Mountain Creek Trails Connector Bridge

n January, the Friends began working with park staff, DCNR engineers, and Gannett Fleming engineers to prepare for the new trail bridge to connect the midsection of Koppenhaver Trail to the western trail head of Mountain Creek Trail. The goal is to create a trail system out of the existing network of relatively short and unconnected trails in the park.

Toward that end, the Friends were awarded a grant from the Cumberland County Land Partnerships Grant Program for \$30,000 and a grant for \$40,000 from the Cumberland Valley Visitors Bureau of the Cumberland Area Economic Development Corporation. These funds were matched with Friends' funds and the in-kind work provided by park staff to grade the site and prepare the foundations for the bridge.

After months of planning, surveying, and obtaining the necessary permits, the new trail bridge finally became a reality near the end of October. In spite of heavy rain throughout the day, the installation went smoothly. Park staff working alongside the Eisenhart Crane crew and the engineers from Gannett Fleming and DCNR finished the bridge installation in less than one day.

The remaining tasks include handrails for the short steps at each end of the bridge, some landscaping, and signage. Meanwhile, people have begun using the bridge to experience the new hiking options created by the bridge which not only connects the Mountain Creek and Koppenhaver Trails, but also increases access to the Appalachian Trail and the Biker-Hiker Trail.

National Public Lands Day

Originally, we had planned to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of Earth Day by planting trees in April. That effort had to be cancelled due to the pandemic, and instead we used National Public Lands Day in September as an opportunity for volunteers to plant native trees in the Fuller Day Use Area. Most of the seventeen trees were planted along Mountain Creek.

Funding for the trees was provided by the Pennsylvania Parks and Forests Foundation and a generous donation by John Lyons in memory of Vicki Rish. As a child, Vicki spent many summers with her family at the park. These trees will ensure that Pine Grove Furnace remains a shady, welcoming place for generations of future families.


