

The Friends of Pine Grove Furnace State Park (FOPGF) was formed in August 2010 as a chapter of the Pennsylvania Parks and Forests Foundation (PPFF). PPFF is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Contributions to PPFF are tax deductible to the fullest extent of the law.

Infrastructure Needs in our Parks and Forests

Did you know that the acreage of our state parks and forests is *twice the size of the state of Delaware*? We are fortunate to have an amazing network of parks and forests in Pennsylvania—about 40 million people visit our parks every year.

Last year, out of concern that our parks might be being "loved to death", the PA Parks and Forests Foundation (PPFF) compiled a report on the infrastructure needs of our parks and forests. According to the report, "The Legacy of Pennsylvania's State Parks and Forests: The Future is in Our Hands", the infrastructure associated with our parks and forests system is massive. Within the 2.5 million acres of parks and forests, there are 3,000 miles of roads; 8,000 miles of trails; 864 bridges; 3,912 boat slips; 6,537 camp sites; and more than 30,000 picnic tables!

Even our own Pine Grove Furnace State Park has infrastructure issues. The staff works very hard to keep the park clean and welcoming for everyone to enjoy, but like many state parks, some of the infrastructure is old and requires constant maintenance. The water main for the park has broken several times in the last two years. The six-inch cast iron pipe is more than fifty years old and serves the entire park; a serious break would force the closure of many of the park's facilities.

There are a number of historical buildings and structures in the park which require constant upkeep. Just this winter, a small portion of the kitchen ceiling in the Ironmaster's Mansion collapsed, revealing the 1829 wood lathing behind the plaster.

This all takes time and money. Today there are fewer staff working in our parks and forests than in 1970 when there were 44 fewer parks. The backlog in maintenance of infrastructure projects is estimated to be \$1 billion. Funds that had once been used for maintenance are now being used to supplement operating expenses. According to the PPFF report, DCNR needs about \$100 million per year of regular and predictable investments in its infrastructure and sufficient staff to maintain its facilities.

PPFF has shared the infrastructure report with the Governor and the General Assembly. Please reach out to your state elected officials to let them know the importance of investing in our parks and forests.
