### THE 2020 TRAIL BRIDGE HAS BEEN POPULAR

Across the country, many people used parks as an outdoor respite during the pandemic. In 2021 we had over 350,000 visits. As people explored our state park, the pedestrian bridge between Koppenhaver and Mountain Creek Trails allowed various new loops and connections.

Chris Houck, our Park Manager, recently noted: "I have received a lot of positive feedback about the bridge and easy access to Koppenhaver Trail. Aside from how great everything looks, people comment that the new trailhead makes it easier to access an area they were not familiar with."

In order to better understand how the new bridge was being used, we attached a trail counter to it on July 1, 2021. The use of the bridge exceeded our expectations. In the last six months of 2021, there were 20,745 crossings of the bridge, or an average of 3,457 per month. We plan to keep the counter As part of the First Day Hike, participants in place into this summer to give us data for an entire 12-month period.
