

## What's next? 20260330

Locally, nationally and internationally, No Kings 3 was a massive success. Locally, Indivisible acted in solidarity with several other groups to host another great event. Our minimum snapshot count was 1,110, but many people left early or showed up after the count, not to mention the many people who participated by honking and waving. Our overall estimate was 2,000. Thanks to all the groups and individuals who made this happen.

It let people know they were not alone, let our opponents know our strength and informed people about how and where to channel their energy. We are stronger together than we are separately.

That is our immediate challenge – What's next? Fortunately, there are a number of things at hand.

- We are holding a meeting to discuss our next steps on 4/4, right after the post office protest. We'll be in the lower level room at the downtown public library. If you have an idea not listed below, let's hear it.

- We will support the formation of a local group of Resistance Singers (and Dancers).
- We are working with other groups to support ICE Out locally. PAO and Socialist Alternative are taking the lead on this.
- Supporting the Keep Families Together package of bills, co-sponsored by our local representative and promoted by Indivisible North central Wisconsin (Wausau).
- Writing and calling campaigns. We are planning to organize a campaign to write and call our elected officials. We want to stiffen the spines of the Dems and yell at the MAGAs. Both can be very satisfying.
- Indivisible has a protest calendar. We will list any event from any ally. For example, PAO is having a Zine Workshop 4/1 at 6 pm. Find the calendar at <https://indicw.org/calendar>. It is a Google calendar and you can subscribe to it. While we welcome anyone in our group, if you want to act with PAO, Portage County Power Moves or any other resistance group, we welcome you as an ally. Stay on our mailing list for information.
- In immediate matters, the Wisconsin Supreme Court elections are on 4/7. The results of the 2024 election were confirmed by the Court by a 5-4. Such a narrow victory for the rule of law requires action. Part of rebuilding our democracy is electing progressive politicians and judges and keeping MAGA sycophants out of power. We recommend Chris Taylor. Sitting on the sidelines risks electing a judge who will rule for Trump.
