Thanks to Tony for auditing the accounts again. Overall we lost £17.57 on meets mainly due to 2 under attended meets. The true balance at the end of the year is £2017.01 and we have already paid out £1114 for deposits for meets in 2025. We have 37 members and 1 social member. Mountaineering Scotland are increasing their subscription by £5 to £26.75. Because the balance is very healthy, I propose that we keep the subscription to £28 even though the club will only get £1.25 of that. We can review this at the end of the year.

As suggested by the Treasurer, the meeting unanimously agreed to keep the sub at £28 for 2025. In response to the Treasurer's report, Oli pointed out that some members might only need social membership which would result in more money being retained for club funds, rather than going to the Mountaineering Scotland. This issue arises due to the fact that with the steep rise in MS membership only a very small proportion now goes to club funds this year. However other members pointed out that the membership renewal form states that social members will not have the benefits of MS membership, including the public liability insurance cover, access to huts, etc. It was also observed that MS does a lot to promote care for the mountain environment, access, safety etc etc and that club members are happy to continue supporting this work.
