Where to stay

OUR TOP PICKS

Condado

Condado caters to those who appreciate the finer things in life. San Juan's most luxurious district is complete with high-class shopping, casinos and upscale clubs and bars. Condado Beach also offers family-friendly watersports, sailing and charters if you're looking for waterbound adventures.

Isla Verde

Isla Verde Beach is close to the airport and has built a reputation as one of the island's top destinations. This is the place to be if you are looking for a more low-key crowd. The nearby Carolina Beach has become a local and hipster haven.

Santruce

Santurce has street art, museums and (perhaps best of all) stellar nightlife. Top clubs, awesome venues and more offer a mix of live and authentic Puerto Rican rap, rock and heavy-metal music. If you want to stay in the middle of the action, Santruce is the place for you!

Rio Grande

Only 30 minutes from San Juan, this tropical paradise combines lush natural beauty with luxury amenities. Home to pristine beaches, world-class golf courses, and the breathtaking El Yunque National Forest, Rio Grande offers a serene escape surrounded by the vibrant hues of the Caribbean.

Luquillo

About an hour from the hustle and bustle of San Juan, Luquillo offers prime beaches for relaxation and quick access to El Yunque National Forest. The other big draw: Los Kioskos de Luquillo, which feature authentic Puerto Rican cuisine, dancing and live music — especially on Friday and Saturday nights.





Car rental

UBER / Taxi

Old San Juan

With its cobblestone streets and colorful houses, Old San Juan transports visitors to a bygone era. Here you will find shady plazas, alongside cool cocktail bars and renowned Caribbean fusion restaurants.



Beaches

All beaches in Puerto Rico are public and free to enjoy. The beaches in Condado or Isla Verde are great. But for a more local option, take a drive about 30 minutes outside San Juan to Luquillo Beach.



Loiza

Settled by Nigerian slaves, Loiza is a great place to experience Afro Caribbean culture. Try street food and support local artisans and street vendors. Loiza is about a 30 minutes drive from Condado.



Castillo San Felipe del Morro

Perched majestically on the cliffs of Old San Juan, this fort offers panoramic views of the Atlantic Ocean and San Juan Bay, inviting visitors to step back in time and immerse themselves in the tales of Puerto Rico's rich past.



Calle de Fortaleza

The vibrant canopy of umbrellas characterizes this unique street of Old San Juan. Here, you can roam the cobblestoned pathways, admire the colonial-era buildings, and shop for souvenirs and handicrafts.



San Juan Botanical Garden

Located on the University of Puerto Rico campus, this free garden is magical. Stop by for a hike, to have a picnic, exercise or just enjoy a bit of green space in the big city.

Old San Juan Walking Tour

Explore the colorful buildings and charming streets of Old San Juan. During a two hour walking tour, you will discover key historic sites and gain new insight into Puerto Rican culture. This is a great opportunity to learn about the many stories of the people who helped to define this unique neighborhood.



Bioluminescent Bay Tour

Enjoy a safe after-dark kayaking adventure to experience the bioluminescence of Mosquito Bay. Paddle in clear and semi-clear-bottomed kayaks and you'll feel totally surrounded by the glowing waters on the island of Vieques. (You will need to take a ferry or flight and stay overnight on Vieques.)



Carabali Adventure Park

Located between the lush foothills of El Yunque National Rainforest and the crystal waters of the Atlantic Ocean, Carabalí Rainforest Adventure Park is a lush outdoor destination with a go-kart track, horseback rides, zip lines, mountain biking & ATVs.



Bacardi Factory Tour & Mixology Class

Enjoy a taste of the Caribbean during a cocktail-making master-class at Casa Bacardí, the Puerto Rican home of Bacardí rum. Discover the secrets of the world-famous rum as you peek behind-the-scenes on a distillery tour, sip a complimentary welcome cocktail, then learn to make classic cocktails like Mojito and Shaken Pina Colada with a demonstration from an expert mixologist.

IS PUERTO RICO SAFE?

Tourism is a huge part of the San Juan economy. So keeping tourist safe is a top priority. Crime is rare and police officers are bilingual. As with any other location, be aware of your surroundings and practice precautions.

WHEN IS THE BEST TIME TO TRAVEL?

Puerto Rico's tropical climate means visitors are treated to warm and sunny weather almost year round. Winter in San Juan is from mid-December through mid-April, when the weather is mostly warm, welcoming and dry. Hurricane season runs from June through November, when the island is the wettest and hottest.

WHAT LANGUAGE IS SPOKEN IN PUERTO RICO?

The official languages of Puerto Rico are English and Spanish. Only 20% of Puerto Ricans speak English fluently, although many working in the service and tourism industry are bilingual.

CAN I STAY CONNECTED?

You don't need an international cellphone plan when traveling to Puerto Rico because the 4G LTE network works with the majority of U.S. cellphone providers. You'll also find free Wi-Fi available at many locations around the island.

IS THE WATER SAFE TO DRINK?

The food and drink standards in Puerto Rico are comparable to those of mainland United States. The tap water is safe to drink as it is filtered and treated at the source.


