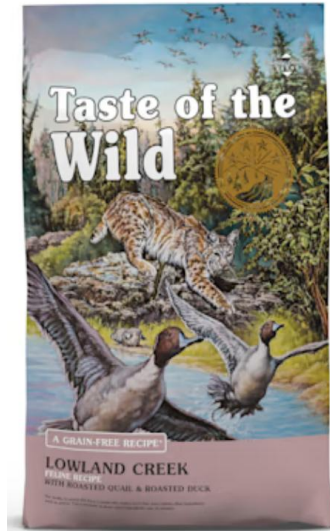


Food Kitten Eats-Recommended

Kittens under 6 months of age in my cattery get a mixture of Taste of the Wild – Lowland Creek with Purina Natural Kitten Chow. You can continue this up to a year or 6 months of age. Taste of the Wild is an ALL STAGES OF LIFE cat food. If you want to continue mixing Purina does have Adult Natural cat food. Or you can just use Prime Feast from Sam's Club if you have a membership. That is what I primarily use for my cats/kittens



Recommend Probiotics/Supplements

**Can Pumpkin has a ton of fiber and is great for gut health. A tsp mix in their wet cat food and they'll never know notice the difference. ProPlan FortiFlora is a GREAT Supplement/Probiotics for your feline's health. Small kittens sprinkle a quarter of a packet in their wet food. Salmon oil is extremely beneficial and they love the taste of it. A Little goes a long way, little kittens only need ½ tsp mix in their wet food. **



Kitty Litter

**I use Special Kitty Litter the majority of the time. If it's not available I'll use Tidy cat. This is the best Kitty Litter I've used that helps with smell and clumping. I also use Pine Pellets from Tractor Supply Co with Stainless Steel Sifting Litter Boxes (Found on Amazon). I recommend Stainless Steel Litter boxes for regular litter and pine pellets, it helps a lot of with the smell, easier to clean, and more sanitary. Plastic Litter boxes hold smell and bacteria. **



Patience and Understanding with your new Kitty

*Remember to give your new kitty time to adjust to their new home! Their confused and don't understand why everything is different. If you already have pets at home, please keep new kitty quarantined from them so they have time to adjust. I suggest a bathroom or area that is closed off. Provide food, water, and litter. Your new kitty can smell their new friends under the door and this gives them time to adjust to all the new smells and friends in their life. This is a big change for your new friend and they need to time to adjust properly. **
