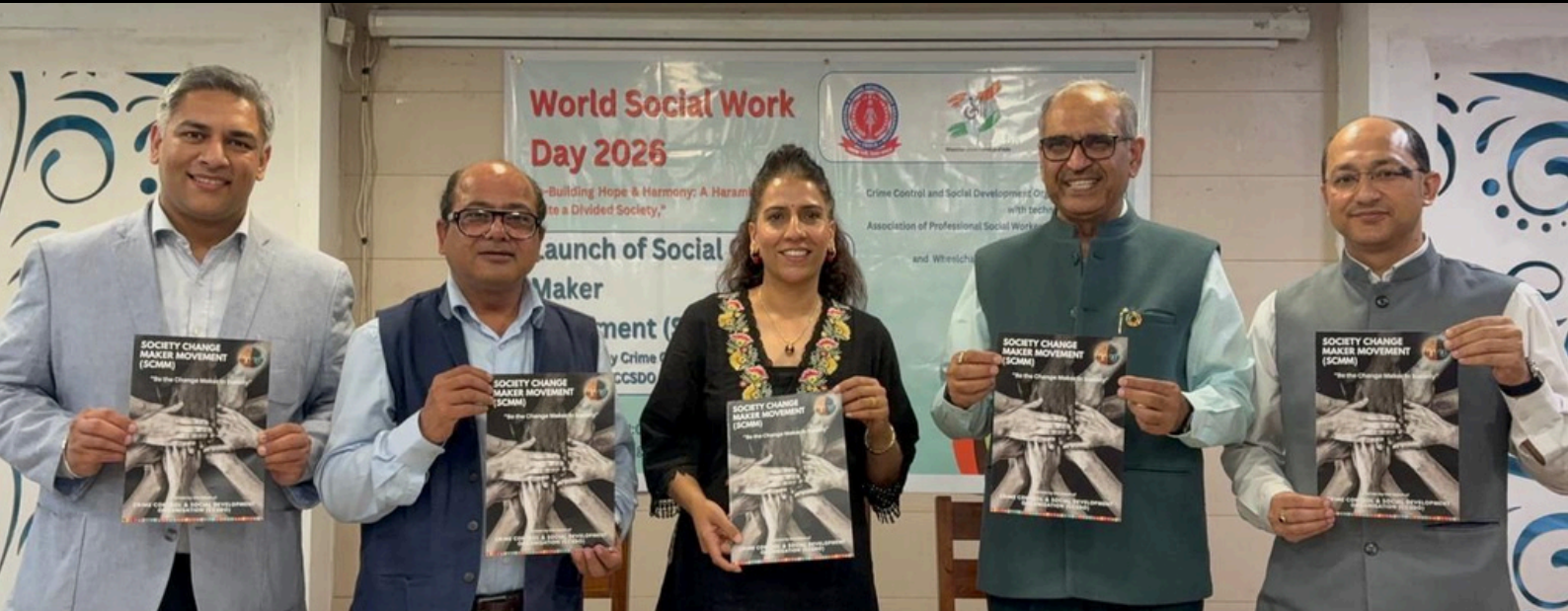

By fostering this multi-stakeholder exchange, APSWDP reaffirmed its dedication to a future where inclusive development and comprehensive health services leave no community behind, aiming for impactful outcomes that will resonate far beyond the conclusion of the conference.

CCSDO and APSWDP Commemorate 77th Republic Day with "Pathways to Inclusion" Initiative

On the occasion of India’s 77th Republic Day, the Crime Control and Social Development Organization (CCSDO) reaffirmed its commitment to the constitutional values of equality and social justice by participating in the community program, “Pathways to Inclusion: Strengthening Support for Vulnerable Communities.” Organized jointly by the Association of Professional Social Workers & Development Practitioners (APSWDP), and CCSDO the event brought together frontline workers, stakeholders,

Breaking Stigma: CCSDO and CCDA, DU Drive Menstrual Health Awareness in Delhi



In a dedicated effort to promote grassroots health and dignity, the Crime Control & Social Development Organisation (CCSDO), in collaboration with **the Centre for Community Development and Action (CCDA), Delhi University** successfully conducted Menstrual Hygiene Awareness Sessions for women in Sanjay Basti and Indira Basti. Led by Social Work trainees under the expert supervision of **Dr. Sudhir Maske**, Director CCDA the initiative reached 58 participants, focusing on dismantling long-standing myths and fostering bodily autonomy. A significant highlight of the outreach was the introduction of menstrual cups as a sustainable, cost-effective, and eco-friendly alternative to traditional products. The sessions encouraged open dialogue, allowing women to voice concerns and explore healthier menstrual practices in a supportive environment. By bridging the gap between health education and sustainable solutions, CCSDO continues to strengthen community resilience, ensuring that menstrual hygiene is recognized as a fundamental pillar of women's empowerment and dignity.

Empowering the Next Generation: CCSDO partnered in regional workshop on Environment and Youth

Recognizing the critical role of young leaders in the fight against the climate crisis, the Crime Control and Social Development Organization (CCSDO) actively partnered with APSWDP and VYK, New Delhi and represented by **Ms. Twinkle Rawat and Mr. Prashant Singh** in a comprehensive two-day workshop on Environment & Youth. Held on December 20–21, 2025, at the prestigious Panjab University, Chandigarh, the event brought together environmentalists, social practitioners, and youth advocates to chart a course for a more sustainable future. The workshop served as an intensive learning hub, offering deep dives into climate change mitigation and adaptation strategies. In the conclave, CCSDO was adjudged as Impactful NGO in transforming the lives of underprivileged youth through skill building and digital empowerment.
