Vocational Training for Stitching & Employment — Tihar Jail

ICCSDO extended its vocational training initiatives to Tihar Jail with the aim of rehabilitating inmates through skill development. The program focused on stitching and tailoring skills to help inmates rebuild their lives with dignity.

Objective:

To equip inmates with employable skills so they can earn livelihoods after release and reintegrate into mainstream society.

Implementation:

- Training classes were conducted inside the jail premises
- Professional instructors taught stitching, cutting and basic tailoring
- Counseling sessions were also conducted to motivate inmates toward positive change

Impact:

- 100+ inmates successfully participated in the training
- Several inmates began working on skill-based projects inside the jail itself
- The program helped improve self-confidence, discipline and hope for the future

Challenges & Solutions:

Many inmates, especially women, initially lacked confidence and clarity about the importance of skill training. The team continuously counseled them, explained the value of skills for a secure future, and motivated them to actively participate.

Vocational Training Center (Stitching) — Jhokukalan, Haryana



To expand outreach in rural communities, CCSDO established a permanent vocational training center in Jhokukalan, Haryana. The center provides continuous stitching and tailoring training for women and young girls.

Objective:
To create a sustainable learning space for marginalized communities and promote long-term self-employment opportunities.

Implementation:

- Collaboration with local organizations and community leaders
- Classrooms were set up with sewing machines and training materials
- Regular batches were conducted by trained instructors

Impact:

- 150+ women successfully trained in stitching and tailoring
- Many participants began earning through home-based work and small tailoring units

Challenges & Solutions:

Initially, awareness about the program was limited and enrollment was low. CCSDO conducted door-to-door awareness campaigns, meetings and community mobilization, resulting in active participation and strong community engagement.



Digital Awareness Programme in 137 Government Schools — Delhi

To bridge the digital divide, CCSDO launched an extensive Digital Awareness Programme across 137 government schools in Delhi.

Objective:

To educate students about safe internet usage, cyber security, and digital opportunities.

Implementation:

- Interactive workshops conducted by digital trainers
- Sessions on cyber safety, responsible social media behavior, e-learning tools
- Awareness discussions on cyberbullying and online privacy

Impact:

- More than 50,000+ students benefited from the program
- Students gained awareness about safe and responsible use of digital platforms
- They learned practical knowledge about the digital world and online opportunities

Challenges & Solutions:

Many students lacked access to digital devices at home. Through demonstrations and group activities, students were still able to understand digital tools and became more confident about navigating the online world safely.

Promotion of Women Entrepreneurs through Corporate Stalls



The organisation set up exhibition and sales stalls in corporate spaces to promote products made by women trained through CCSDO programs.

Purpose:

To provide women with real market exposure and income opportunities.

Outcome:

- Women showcased handmade garments, stitched items and craft products
- They interacted directly with customers and corporate employees
- The initiative boosted confidence and supported financial independence
