## Career Counselling Initiative Launched in Government Schools

CCSDO successfully launched a structured Career Counselling Initiative in government schools. The program has been designed to equip students with the knowledge and confidence needed to make informed academic and career choices in an increasingly competitive environment.

Through a series of professionally facilitated interactive sessions, students were introduced to various career pathways, emerging job sectors, skill requirements, and higher education opportunities. Special emphasis was placed on aligning students' interests, aptitude, and abilities with suitable future career options.

## Key Highlights

- Career counselling formally introduced across multiple government schools
- Interactive workshops conducted by trained career counsellors
- Students guided on subject selection, vocational options, and higher education pathways
- Focus on building self-confidence, awareness, and goal-setting skills


## Nayi Roshni Project –

Education for Underprivileged Children in Yamuna Khadar



We have started the Nayi Roshni Project in Yamuna Khadar to support underprivileged children living in this area. The project focuses on providing basic education and skill development so that children who are not attending school can be connected to learning in a safe environment through bridge classes and community-based support.

Education is especially important in Yamuna Khadar because many children face poverty, frequent displacement, and lack of schools and learning facilities. Through education, these children gain confidence, life skills and better opportunities for their future, helping them move towards mainstream schooling and a more secure life.

# 4 Years of CCSDO



We celebrated 4 years of CCSDO with children in a very simple and happy way. There was no big program, but we spent time with the kids, played games, and shared smiles and laughter together. Being with them made the celebration meaningful.

Even though we didn't do many activities, the children's happiness made the day special for all of us. Playing with them and celebrating together created beautiful memories and gave us motivation to continue our work with the same positivity.

## Promoting Health and Safety through First Aid Kit Distribution

We have distributed first aid kits in government schools to promote health and safety among students. The objective of this initiative is to equip schools with essential emergency medical supplies so that minor injuries and health issues can be handled on time. This activity is being implemented in partnership with healthcare organizations for smooth distribution.

Through this initiative, around 50,000 students and staff now have access to first aid support in schools. In some schools, trained personnel were not available, so basic first aid training was also provided to teachers and staff to ensure effective use of the kits.



## Stationary Distribution to 500 Students in Gov. Schools



We distributed stationery items to 500+ students in government schools. The distribution included notebooks, pens, pencils and other basic study materials so that children could regularly attend classes and study comfortably. Many students lack basic learning materials, and this small support helped reduce that gap.

The main motive of this initiative was to encourage children to continue their education with interest and confidence. By providing stationery, we wanted to make sure that no child misses learning just because they do not have notebooks or pens. This also motivated students to stay in school and focus more on their studies.

## POSH Training Conducted for 400+ Employees



We conducted POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) awareness sessions in companies, covering more than 400 employees. The sessions focused on creating a safe and respectful workplace by explaining what constitutes sexual harassment, employees' rights, and the responsibilities of organizations under the POSH Act. Real-life examples and interactive discussions helped participants understand the topic clearly. The objective of these sessions was to build awareness, encourage safe reporting, and promote zero tolerance toward harassment at the workplace. Employees were informed about internal complaint committees, legal provisions, and supportive mechanisms available to them. The training helped organizations strengthen their workplace policies and foster a culture of dignity and respect.

## Breast Cancer Awareness Program Collaboration with Prabhaav Foundation

We organized a Breast Cancer Awareness Program to spread awareness among women and adolescent girls about early detection and prevention. During the sessions, participants were informed about symptoms, self-examination methods, and the importance of regular check-ups. Doctors and health educators interacted with the participants and cleared their doubts in simple language.

The main purpose of this program was to reduce fear and increase awareness so that breast cancer can be identified at an early stage. Women were encouraged to take care of their health, talk openly about problems, and seek medical help on time. The program helped participants understand that early detection saves lives.



## Menstrual Hygiene session & HIV AIDS Awareness for ASHA Workers

We conducted a Menstrual Hygiene Awareness Session for ASHA workers to strengthen their knowledge on women's health and hygiene practices. During the session, information was shared about safe menstrual practices, use and disposal of sanitary products, common health issues, HIV-AIDS awareness, and how to counsel adolescent girls and women in the community.

The objective of this session was to enable ASHA workers to spread correct information at the grassroots level. After the training, they felt more confident to talk openly about menstrual health and HIV-AIDS prevention, break myths and taboos, and support women in maintaining better hygiene, safety, and dignity during menstruation.
