Grades 1–2

◆ Concepts: **Identity, Author, Character**



Conceptual Understanding/ Focus:
Stories help us understand who we are and how we are different from others.



Learning Engagement:
Read multiple books by the same author; discuss how the author's identity shapes stories.




Project Idea:
Author Study Poster – Explore recurring themes across an author's work.





Conceptual Transfer:
Compare how **authors' identities influence the characters** they create in different books or cultures.

Concepts: **Community, Library Rules, Helpers**

 Conceptual Understanding / Focus:
Communities function best when everyone adheres to shared rules and responsibilities.

 Learning Engagement:
Create a class contract for library rules; role-play helper responsibilities.

 Project Idea:
Community Mural – Illustrate how everyone contributes to a safe, inclusive library.

 Conceptual Transfer:
Apply understanding of **shared responsibilities in the library** to digital citizenship or classroom communities.

Concepts: **Change, Story Events, Series Books**

 Conceptual Understanding / Focus:

Change shapes characters, stories, and how we grow as readers.

 Learning Engagement:

Compare characters from the start to the end of a story to explore changes.

 Project Idea:

Story Timeline – Show how characters or settings change over time.

 Conceptual Transfer:

Relate character growth in stories to changes in students' own lives, like moving schools or gaining new roles.

Concepts: **Expression, Book Illustrations, Read-Alouds**



Conceptual Understanding / Focus:

We express ideas and feelings through pictures, words, and voice.



Learning Engagement:

Draw or dramatise scenes from a story to express emotions and ideas.



Project Idea:

Class Book of Expressions – Combine student artwork and emotions in one book.



Conceptual Transfer:

Compare expressions in books, audiobooks, and movies to understand how **different media convey similar ideas.**



Grades 3–4

Concepts: **Perspective, Biographies, Folktales**

 Conceptual Understanding / Focus:

People's perspectives shape how stories are told and understood.

 Learning Engagement:

Read biographies and folktales from different cultures; discuss the storyteller's view.

 Project Idea:

Culture Booklet – Compare how different cultures view the same concept (e.g., heroism).

 Conceptual Transfer:

Contrast perspectives from folktales of different cultures or periods; relate to history or current events.

Concepts: **Organisation, Classification Systems, Index**

 Conceptual Understanding / Focus:

Organising information helps us access and use knowledge efficiently.

 Learning Engagement:

Use a scavenger hunt to teach how to find books using the index or classification.

 Project Idea:

Library Tour Guides – Students teach younger peers how to navigate the library.

 Conceptual Transfer:

Apply library classification systems to **organising personal collections** or science data categories.

Concepts: **Culture, Multicultural Books, Traditions**



Conceptual Understanding / Focus:
Stories reflect the values and traditions of different cultures.



Learning Engagement:
Explore picture books from different cultures and discuss shared traditions.



Project Idea:
Global Story Festival – Students present a story from their culture with visuals.



Conceptual Transfer:
Use stories from various cultures to explore how traditions and values influence behaviors and beliefs.

Concepts: **Pattern, Story Structure, Repeated Genres**

 Conceptual Understanding / Focus:

Recognising patterns helps us predict, understand, and enjoy what we read.

 Learning Engagement:

Map story arcs or recurring structures in favourite books or genres.

 Project Idea:

Genre Tracker Chart – Create graphs showing reading preferences and story types.

 Conceptual Transfer:

Track similar story structures across genres and then connect to life patterns or recurring events in history.



Grades 5-6

Concepts: **Evidence, Primary/Secondary Sources**

 Conceptual Understanding / Focus:

Strong evidence helps us support our ideas and evaluate information.

 Learning Engagement:

Evaluate two sources on the same topic for credibility and evidence.

 Project Idea:

Source Credibility Infographic – Design a visual comparing reliable vs. unreliable sources.

 Conceptual Transfer:

Evaluate claims across different text types and apply them to peer discussions or social debates.

Macro Concept: **System, Information, Database**

Navigation



Conceptual Understanding / Focus:

Classification Systems help us categorise, store, and retrieve information.



Learning Engagement:

Conduct a library treasure hunt using Dewey Decimal clues.



Project Idea:

Build-a-Library – Students design and explain their library classification system.



Conceptual Transfer:

Transfer understanding of classification systems to systems in technology or nature (e.g., search engines, ecosystems).

Macro Concept: **Bias, Author's Purpose, News Reports**



Conceptual Understanding / Focus

All information reflects a particular viewpoint, which shapes how people understand or respond to it.



Learning Engagement:

Analyse headlines from different news sources to detect bias.



Project Idea:

News Detective Journal – Weekly reflections on identifying bias in current events.



Conceptual Transfer:

Identify author bias and then compare with media, advertisements, or opinion pieces in other disciplines.



Grades 7-8 |

Concepts: **Power, Propaganda, Media Influence**

 Conceptual Understanding / Focus

Information can be used to shape beliefs and control narratives.

 Learning Engagement:

Debate: "Can media influence what people believe?"
using real-world news examples.

 Project Idea:

Media Mindset Campaign – Create posters showing how media shapes perception.

 Conceptual Transfer:

Analyse how media framing affects public opinion;
connect with propaganda in history or literature.

Macro Concept: **Ethics, Citation, Intellectual Property**



Conceptual Understanding/ Focus

Ethical research respects ownership, truth, and shared knowledge.



Learning Engagement:

Teach citation and plagiarism through real-life case studies.



Project Idea:

Citation Guidebook – Students create a handbook for ethical research and referencing.



Conceptual Transfer:

Discuss the ethical use of sources and relate it to responsible behaviour in digital or social environments.

Macro Concept: **Interdependence, Open-Source, Information Networks**



Conceptual Understanding / Focus:
Sharing and accessing information create global interdependence.



Learning Engagement:
Create collaborative wikis or research boards across classes or grade levels.



Project Idea:
Open Knowledge Web – Map how different sources contribute to shared understanding.



Conceptual Transfer:
Explore how shared knowledge contributes to global learning communities (e.g., Wikipedia or Creative Commons).

Macro Concept: **Expression, Blogs, Multimedia Reviews**



Conceptual Understanding / Focus

People use diverse formats to express opinions, beliefs, and creativity.



Learning Engagement:

Publish a multimedia book review blog or podcast episode.



Project Idea:

Student Literary Review Blog – Share book reviews or opinion pieces using multimedia tools.



Conceptual Transfer:

Use formats like blogs, podcasts, and visual storytelling to transfer traditional book reviews to new media.
