Pastor's Note

= Holy Week =

What is Easter without Holy Week?

The month of April will be a journey, a journey from Lent, into Holy Week and then Easter, on April 20th. Easter is one of the most highly attended services of the entire year, a pretty close second to Christmas Eve. Christmas, the birth of Jesus and Easter, the resurrection of Jesus are indeed very important to the life of a person of faith. But...what is Easter without Holy Week? Might I suggest that there would be nothing to celebrate at Easter if it weren't for Jesus' death?

I invite you to celebrate the fullness of Easter by coming to the Holy Week services. Wave the palm branches to welcome Jesus into town on Palm Sunday. Know the vulnerability of love as Judas, Jesus' friend, takes a bribe to betray Jesus. Experience Jesus the compassionate servant as he cares for the disciples at the Passover meal...spoiler alert, he even cares for those he knew would betray him.

We know the week ends in the death of Jesus. Good Friday isn't very good at all. We can hear the cries of the angry mob. I think the thing that gets me the most about the outcries is that most of them never met Jesus. They didn't know him. How can we kill something we don't know? Are we that uncomfortable with being uncomfortable?

We are an Easter people. We know the end of the story. We know that Good Friday has an anecdote. We know that God shows up. We know that those in power do not win in the end. We know that love conquers all. Resurrection and redemption are the songs we sing because He Lives.

I invite you to experience the entire story this year. Arrive at Easter by way of Holy Week...and you will taste the sweetness on your tongue when we sing, "God's redeeming work is done, Alleluia!"

Bring a fresh flower or branch from a tree to decorate the cross.

Sunrise Breakfast will be served at 7:00 am in the New Fellowship Hall

Sunday, April 20th: Easter Service, 10 am (sanctuary)

I close with a prayer from Joyce Rupp for Holy Thursday:

There are certain times when I am called
To perform menial tasks that I dislike.
Wipe away any superiority or self-importance
That clings to my resistance in serving others.
I want to approach work in the way you did. Amen.

Thank you all so much that have participated!

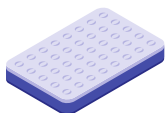
Now we are on our way to the 3rd well!

The youth and four adults traveled to Johns River Valley Camp on March 15th. We got up early, and loaded the church bus at 6:30am to head to the mountains. Once we started driving down the last road before the turn to the camp, we could start seeing the devastation from Hurricane Helene. The riverbed had gotten so high during the storm and moved so much of the riverbed, trees, and huge boulders. Gary Owens, a longtime counselor at the camp stated on our way that he had never seen the camp like this. Once we got to the camp, we were introduced to the dining hall where we got a brief snack before getting right to work. We were stationed around the camp and our various jobs included splitting wood, stacking wood, loading wood into a trailer, and throwing wood into a natural pit made by the storm. In no time, we started seeing the efforts of our hard work pay off as the fire got bigger and the piles of debris cleared away. We stopped for lunch where we were treated to delicious pulled pork, and got to sit with Executive Director Kevin. We got to learn more about camp in the summer, and also about all the work that has happened and will continue to be happening as they get ready for summer camp. On our way back, we stopped at the Humane Society of Catawba County to unload over 450 pounds of cat food, dog food, cat litter, toys, and other animal supplies that you all helped us to collect. The folks at the shelter were immensely grateful, and we got to visit with the cats and dogs and learn more about their stories.

On behalf of those that went, we are so grateful for the church's support of our pet supply drive and of our trip. It was an impactful trip in many ways. I told the youth that not many kids would choose to go on a work trip on their weekend and what may only be their only free day of the week. On the way home, Pastor Kristin led us in a short reflection where we all shared one thing we would hold with us for the weeks to come from this trip. Hearing all of the different impacts from the youth and adults alike will be something I will continue to hold with me. We have truly awesome youth, and I encourage the congregation to ask them about our trip.

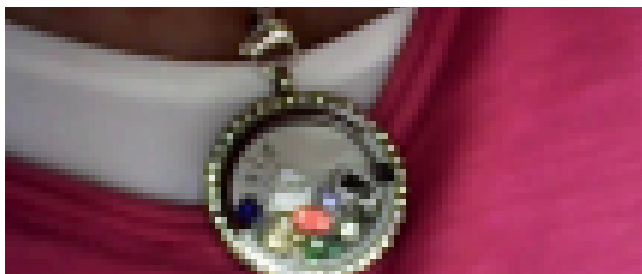

The meeting was called to order by Gloria Apple, a quorum was established, and all were welcomed.

Lighting of the Christ Candle

A devotional was provided by Dora Moore focusing on our calling to be imitators of Christ and to walk in love as he did, especially during this month of love.

We Celebrate our Past

Approval of Minutes:

A motion was made by Dora Moore and seconded by Lisa Sinclair to approve the minutes from the January 2025 consistory meeting with one revision regarding a seconded motion. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report:

January 2025 Consolidated Fund Activity Report showed a balance of \$178,016.63 with receipts of \$16,726.33 and Disbursements of \$25,809.36 reported. A motion was made by Don Kirkman and seconded by Cheryl Royal to approve the report. Motion carried. Discussion was held to review if the expenses for the recent youth trip were paid from the Youth Fund or the Youth Account in the General Fund Budget. Should have been from the Youth Fund. Also discussed possibility of tracking money collected for use of space/facilities by non-church members.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Kristin reported the funerals of two Mt. Hope members, William Welker on January 4, 2025 and Gerry Clapp on February 1, 2025. The church also had one baptism, Dona Branson, during the past month. Three individuals are seeking to join as members of Mt. Hope: Andrew Beach, Chris Caviness and Lisa Johnson. Tammy Holt made the motion to offer membership and Lisa Sinclair seconded. Motion passed.

Pastor Kristin also invited consistory members to participate in the second new member class to be held on March 9th as they discuss our local church as a part of the denomination. Kristin shared that plans for her sabbatical are still in process even though the grant application from last year was not granted.

There continue to be many people in need of prayers in our church community.

Committee Reports

Board of Christian Education	Safe Church training scheduled for February 23rd during Gather Learn Grow time. Consistory members need to complete the training, in person or on-line.
Maintenance and Trustees	Phillip Strouth and Stan Buff met with consistory to review and discuss facility needs. It was decided to establish steady temperatures for the sanctuary and education building to help with humidity issues and piano maintenance concerns. Winter base temperature was to be 67 degrees with increases for the sanctuary during services. Heaters in the hallway are in need of cleaning and repair. Discussion was held on unpleasant odors in the Old Fellowship Hall, as well as sulfur smell coming from water. It was decided to check with the well company and to get the water tested. Stan Buff will follow up on this matter. Discussion was also held on the need for repair to the columns in front of the church. Phillip Strouth will follow up with this issue. It was also decided to establish a way to identify one Trustee per month who would be designated as the person to contact when needs arise at the church and to check on facility needs related to events at the church.
