Pastor's Note

“Listen to the Toilet”



“That’s it! I’m going to get a new one. I am tired of messing with this old one.” he said as he threw the chain down, exasperated. Despite his best efforts, Mike couldn’t get the leaking toilet to stop leaking. “What can I help you do,” I found myself responding. I really didn’t want him to replace the toilet. Yes, it is expensive to replace the whole thing, but the expense wasn’t my motivation for wanting to keep the old one. Yes, the old one is indeed, well, old and it is smaller than the new toilets today and if you have to know, it is low enough to the ground that my feet rest comfortably on the ground when needed. Yet, it wasn’t the size of the toilet that motivated my desire to keep it. Mike kept working and I kept helping in hopes that we could fix the old one He did. Until it leaks again.

It still leaks, from time to time, that old toilet, but I don’t mind it. There’s something comforting about keeping something that doesn’t work, something that isn’t...perfect. That’s why I want to keep it. Not because it is expensive or it is the right size, but because it reminds me that being perfect is overrated. Not just overrated, it is impossible. But yet, we try for perfection all the time, just to fall short and beat ourselves up for not getting it right.

This old toilet has taught me patience. It has taught me to be attentive and to pay attention. It reminds me to slow down and listen and tune my ear to its ever-swirling waters.

But we are supposed to be perfect. Isn’t that what we are working for? Perfection? “Be ye perfect as your Father in Heaven is perfect?” A scripture that is often taken out of context will lead us astray. Matthew includes this scripture (Chapter 5) as he tells the good news about loving our enemies. But what he says is, “anyone can hate their enemies, even people who don’t follow in the ways of Jesus, but be WHOLE, COMPLETE like God and pray for them. Be so complete in your knowledge and understanding of God’s love for you that you can love even your enemies.”

This old toilet is a good reminder in the Lenten season that as we move ever closer to the cross in our desire to connect more deeply with God, that we are also loved by God for being exactly who we are right now in this point in history. I am happy to have this old toilet in our house. It reminds me that God cares for me, too, even when I am less than who I want to be. Even when the waters of life (and my brain) are ever-swirling. This old toilet reminds me that we are in this together. As I hear the endless-swirl of the water from a tank that doesn’t have the capacity to fill itself up, I believe I hear it calling me, “Hey, you, can you help me?” I have chosen to say, “Yes.” And as I jiggle the handle until it has what it needs to survive yet another day at the Vaughn house, I am reminded that God says, “Yes!” to me and you, too.

Do you have a loose part of your faith? Is there someone you would like to have completely out of your life because they are like a thorn in your side? What makes you angry enough to abolish it, to get rid of it, completely? Before you decide to throw it out, take a moment and ask, “What could this inconvenience, this thorn in my side, this person that makes me angry, teach me about myself and about God’s love? You might just decide to keep it if you pay attention to it long enough.

Give us courage, O God, to grow our table ever wider and longer—
