# Pastor's Note



## Pastor's Love Letter: "How Are Your Houseplants?"

I have vivid memories of watering the houseplants when I was growing up. I don't remember the particulars like the water vessel we used to take water from the sink to the plant dependent on us to connect the two. I don't remember the kinds of plants, I just remembered that we gave them attention. We watered them and we pulled off the dead leaves and blooms that had already had their day in the sun. And somewhere between my house and Mamaw's house, I learned the wisdom of this saying, "You can tell the health of your spirit by looking at your house plants." It was one of those sayings that I heard but wouldn't remember it or understand it until decades later when I began to have houseplants in my own place. When my houseplant began to droop and I wondered why it wasn't doing very well, this old saying flooded my memory again. "You can tell the health of your spirit by looking at your house plants." From the look of my houseplant, my spirit was weary, droopy and was lacking a lot of what it needed.

I still have the houseplant I was looking at when I remembered that saying. The plant is 30 years old. It is a hearty plant, a Thanksgiving Cactus, yet it has been through some seasons. It has thrived and bloomed; it has gone years without the sunlight it needed and thus didn't bloom for nearly a decade before I noticed. It has wilted until its leaves were thin and withered. It has come back from severed malnutrition. My spiritual companion has most recently experienced root rot and lost all but a tiny green sprig of its life, yet where there is green there is hope. Today, you can stop by the office anytime and see that the plant is making its way back into a full recovery and is growing full and green. The church window has magical properties for houseplants.

This summer as we enter into the liturgical time of the year of growth marked by the green vestments in the service, I will ask you, "How are your houseplants?" Are you paying them any of your attention? Are they getting the right amount of water? Do they need more or less sunlight? And if your houseplants are any indication of your own spirit, I would ask you, "How is your spirit?" What do you need to grow this season? Do you need more meaningful work to do? Do you need to rest? Are you getting what you need to grow? Are you paying attention to your own needs so that you might thrive as whole beings ready to serve when God calls?

How are your houseplants? Really, I am serious, go look at them.

**Approval of Minutes:**

A motion was made by Tammy Holt and seconded by Tracy Buff to approve the minutes from the April 2025 consistory meeting. Motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report:**

April 2025 Consolidated Fund Activity Report showed an ending balance of \$177,124.72 with total receipts of \$20,565.96 and total disbursements of \$25,141.36 reported. The General Fund end balance was \$6,643.58 with receipts of \$17,961.21 and disbursements of \$24,491.29. A motion was made by Lisa Sinclair and seconded by Cindy McGee to approve the report. Motion carried.

-Concern has been raised regarding the frequency of mowing. This issue will be addressed.






